Administrative News:

Patricia Pettijohn (POY 124, x3580) and Rosie Wilson (POY 213, x3403) are not in the campus telephone directory. Please make note if you have not already done so.

Automation News:

USF/SPJC student id numbers (215...) are not in the proxy database and will not be added in the future. SJPC students taking classes on this campus and SPJC faculty cannot access proprietary (Lexis/Nexis, FirstSearch, etc.) databases via the Virtual Library from remote (i.e. off campus) locations.

Federal Tax Forms (98.2, Final Version) is loaded at the standalone machine. Load the CD and double click the Federal Tax Forms icon. Adobe Exchange opens up. Go to File, scroll down and select item 2 in the recently used files list called all_list.pdf. This opens a 157-page pdf file that is a list of form names with hotlinks to the forms themselves. You can either scroll through the list or click the binoculars on the toolbar to search by a keyword like "extension." You will then move to that place in the big list and be able to link to the actual form.

JAWS for Windows is a screen reader for the visually impaired. Karilyn Jaap is handling training and scheduling

Circulation / Reserve News:

The hydraulic wheelchair is available at the Circulation desk.

We are providing library services to community college students, besides those from SPJC who are taking classes at USF. The basics are:

Use **LPEC** (instead of LPER) for ALL community college personnel.

The patron codes are: **LCFA** for ALL CC faculty
LCSF for ALL CC staff
LCSP for SPJC/USF students (i.e. those SPJC students enrolled in USF classes on this campus with the special USF/SPJC green and yellow ID)
LCST for all other CC students

We have a listing at Circulation for the codes for each Florida Community College, and this code needs to be put into the record carefully. A sample record with instruction is in the manual. The instructions for all community college transactions are in the white binder marked **SPJC/USF students**).

When a CC student asks for privileges, a record must be put in our system for them. They will need to fill out the patron form at Circulation. Then input the barcode # from their id, using the PC closest to the exit.

The PCs at Circulation give access to the FCLA site that provides validation for CC patrons. The site has been bookmarked. Click on the site and then fill in the CC patron's social security number. A copy of the site and examples have been placed in the instruction binder.

SPJC has extended privileges to members of the public who hold a public library card. We have already had questions from the general public about using our library "because JC allows them to use their library". This does not involve us; it is a JC service only.
