AFFIDAVIT TO EXPLAIN LACK OF PASSPORT.

STEWART, Vice Consul of the United States of America in and for the Consular District of Vigo, Spain, duly commissioned and qualified, personally came JOSEFA LOPEZ DE OURAL, who, being duly sworn deposes and says that she was born at S. Jorge de Lorenzana, Lugo, Spain, October 22, 1894, that she married in Habana, Cuba, to RAMON OURAL, born in S. Jorge de Lorenzana, Lugo, Spain. She further deposes that she is unable to obtain a passport from the de jure Spanish Authorities on account of the present state of war in Spain.
