Appointments were made by department heads. The first meeting in November with follow up meetings in the spring. The forum was used to share information on current global initiatives and solicit input/feedback on what was in place and suggestions for improvement. However, an internationalization plan was not developed. Example of feedback: Suggestions were made to modify the International Visitor Grant (IVG) process so that it would be better utilized by faculty. (06/19/2019) Analysis of Findings: Sharing information and getting input from faculty and staff on international initiatives was valuable. It increased awareness of current activities and established allies for the unit. We did have issues with the appointments and scheduling the first meeting, so the launch was not until late fall. It was decided to hold on developing a strategic internationalization plan due to the unknowns of consolidation.</p>	<p>Use of Findings: We are still pending clarification of the structure for the Global Initiatives Office due to consolidation. It is unknown if the office will be autonomous or report to USF World and leadership in Tampa. Once the structure is established, I can better assess how to move forward with leading internationalization at USF St. Petersburg. (06/19/2019)</p>

		<p>Reporting Period: 2018 - 2019</p> <p>Conclusion: Exceeds Expectations</p> <p>International Scholar and Fulbright participation increased by 1 from the previous year. The number of International visitors increased by 17 participants in 2018-2019 from the previous year. (06/19/2019)</p> <p>Analysis of Findings: USFSP hosted two international groups in 2018-2019. One group of students from Ameri-Can Academy in Weifang China and a group of professors from Changzhi University. USFSP developed programming and coordinated logistics for both groups. We had one group of college students from Weifang University that we had planned to host who were denied visas to the United States. For 2019-2020, we are planning on only hosting one group of college students from Weifang University. It is pending visa approval. Changzhi had a leadership change and is not sending a group and Ameri-Can did not recruit a group for the upcoming year.</p>	<p>Use of Findings: Develop an outreach plan to faculty in order to promote hosting international scholars. We are in the process of developing a fee-based scholar program pending USF System approval. (06/19/2019)</p>
