

OA Copyright Models (Hoorn & van der Graaf)

- Author retains copyright (free classroom use, journal is licensed as first publisher)
- Copyright is shared (Creative Commons license)
- Author transfers all commercial rights to publisher



Survey of Authors (Hoorn & van der Graaf)

- 46.5% prefer to keep copyright
- 29.9% prefer Creative Commons model
- 15.8% prefer commercial rights transferred to publisher
- 7.9% have no preference or don't know



Creative Commons licenses (Open Access Scholarly Information Sourcebook)

- Trend toward publishers not requiring copyright transfer
- Creative Commons is a collection of licenses (for different purposes)
- Example: No commercial derivatives, but other re-use is not restricted




Self-Archiving (Open Access Scholarly Information Sourcebook)

"Currently, around 60% of publishers and 95% of journals registered in SHERPA permit self-archiving in some form."
