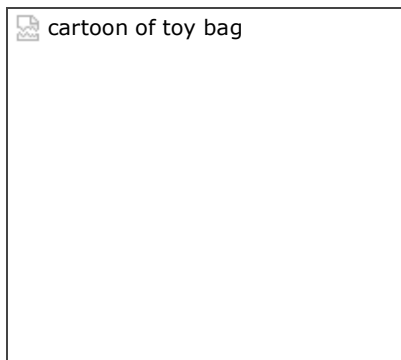
There is also a community Breakfast before the Parade at the Hilton Hotel. Ticket information will follow shortly.
