Announcements:

1. USFSP's strategic plan "Points of Focus" has been submitted to the ACE workgroup for their review and this is the last stop prior to USF Board of Trustees. The strategic plan may then be approved by the BOT either via conference call or at the next meeting.
2. Academic Learning Compacts (ALCs) are in various stages of completeness. The faculty and department chairs/program coordinators have completed the difficult part of reviewing, commenting and updating their ALCs. In general what remains is final review and approval by the respective deans.
3. GE Assessment information from University Assessment Day (March 19<sup>th</sup>) was compiled and submitted to each of the college deans for dissemination to their department chairs/program coordinators and faculty. A call for final comments and narratives will be made to department chairs/program coordinators and faculty via the college deans. The proposed deadline is early May.
4. GE Assessment data for Spring 2010 is also due at the end of the semester.

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In addition to discussion items noted above, the PEBC reviewed the Legislative Budget Request (LBR) for 2010-11 and the University's Proposed New Degree Programs for 2010-11 through 2013-14 to ensure alignment with the University's Strategic Plan.

The new academic programs listed on the proposal form were to then be included in a new planning tool implemented by the SUS/BOG called the 2010 University Work Plan Proposal which is due to the USF System office by the end of April. The Work Plan included a section on tuition differential and David Everingham presented on this section of the document.

Select elements from the proposed degree program worksheet are presented below with PEBC recommendations—which include: the alignment with the strategic plan, and the recommendation that degree programs be added to the LBR for 2011-12.
