Executive Summary

In fall 2011, the Academic Resources Unit of the University of South Florida (USF) Library officially launched Scholar Commons, an institutional repository (IR) intended to serve as a virtual showcase for USF's research and creative energies. Scholar Commons, which can be accessed at: <http://scholarcommons.usf.edu/>, provides digital preservation and free open access (OA) to scholarly works produced by the USF Community. Our vision is to become a vehicle to drive research communication across academic disciplines.

Through our dedication to and outreach of scholarly communications, we have generated many positive outcomes. This report chronicles our initiatives during the 2014/2015 fiscal year (FY), and includes:

- A review of the purpose, people, and platform behind Scholar Commons
- A recap of our design additions and changes
- A summary of where and why new content was added
- A study of current reports and statistics

Security and Preservation

Scholar Commons and bepress have implemented several levels of preservation to ensure the integrity and security of materials in the repository:

- The bepress platform features a multi-tiered disaster recovery plan that utilizes fail-over servers. These servers have regular on-site and off-site backups
 - Most of the Scholar Commons journal content is preserved in LOCKSS (an OAIS-compliant preservation strategy that provides tools for libraries to back up each other's content).
 - Internal weekly backups of Digital Commons and Dublin Core metadata, made available by bepress OAI, are collected and stored within Research Computing servers here at USF.
 - USF Research Computing performs its own backups, which are stored at a location in Winter Haven, FL. Quarterly reports of content are delivered by bepress and also secured at this location.

- This year we formally established the Digital Commons Private LOCKSS Network (DC PLN) in conjunction with other Digital Commons users. Memorandums of Understanding have been signed and we are still working on getting all members live and harvesting content.

Design

The Scholar Commons pages are periodically reviewed for adjustments. This year, the Scholar Commons homepage had a few exciting changes.



The sidebar links (under “Browse By” and “Useful Links”) were adjusted to help facilitate easier navigation throughout the repository. Links were added so our Open Access Collections, Most Popular Papers, Recent Additions, and USF Faculty Publications could be directly accessed from the sidebar.

We also added some cosmetic changes to the homepage. First, we expanded the homepage’s “welcome note” to better educate visitors about Scholar Commons. We updated the rotating featured images (which are switched out on a regular basis by our Library Specialist, Brenna Mathiasen).

Our most notable homepage change is the inclusion of a readership map. This new feature from bepress provides a live display of what’s being read and where (the map can be customized to show readership on an hourly, daily, weekly, or monthly average). The readership map is included on journals’ homepages.



Ongoing Projects

FAIR/CV Bank Project

Now that we have copies of the records within the FAIR Vita Bank, we are working on adding content harvested from faculty curriculum vitae (CVs) to include in the repository. This will involve determining which publishers allow preprints or post-prints to be included in the repository, and which will need a link out to the full text on an external site. Any items already within Scholar Commons will be removed to avoid duplication.

CAS Pilot Project

Through previous connections with Chuck Connor in the School of Geosciences, we were able to start the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) pilot project in late fall 2013. We worked with three specific departments—Psychology, Communication, and the School of Geosciences—to obtain updated CVs from faculty members with their permission to load these items into their associated series. We also created a document to record the name of a faculty member who decided not to participate. We will retain this file and use it in the future to record any other faculty members who express the desire to opt out of having their content included within the IR.

In 2014, project assistants Alex Onac, Ashley Peltzman, and Frankie Fernandez converted these citations to spreadsheets. These spreadsheets were updated and checked before loading into their respective series. After loading the items, the project assistants completed a quick Google search on each item to try and locate a URL to an electronic source or reference to each item. These URLs were reviewed for accuracy and then added to each record. The project assistants then reviewed each item within SHERPA/RoMEO to determine if we have permission to load the pre-print, post-print, or publisher version of the full-text.

This project stalled after the departure of USF's institutional repository manager in early 2015. However, the Scholar Commons team is growing and we have picked up where we left off. Currently, we are locating the contact email for the person or unit responsible for article (or book chapter) permissions. We are finished with the Geosciences collection, approximately 2/3 of the way finished with the Communications collection, and are continuing to work our way through the Psychology collection.

OA Textbooks Collection

Scholar Commons hosts 8 open access textbooks, with another 3 titles being listed with links out to the full text. Eight of the titles focus on mathematics, with the remaining three covering writing, journalism, and social science. The most heavily used title is *Social Science Research: Principles, Methods, and Practices*, with 203,964 downloads since it was first uploaded to Scholar Commons. Like the bulk of the repository content, all of the OA textbooks are preserved in the Digital Commons Private LOCKSS Network for long-term, stable archiving.

Our OA textbooks are part of the Textbook Affordability Project (TAP), saving students at USF and worldwide the cost of expensive textbooks. In turn, this increases students' chances of continuing their education affordably. In 2015, the TAP team began to develop USF's first funded open access textbook: a children's literature textbook by Dr. Jennifer Schneider. Another exciting development in Textbook Affordability is that funding shifted to the Library, and we are taking the lead with Innovation Education as partner for our next open access textbook as announced by the Provost.

Conference Collection

Scholar Commons provides a page for sponsoring faculty member(s) to centralize their conference information. Because the sites are hosted in Scholar Commons, they enjoy the discoverability benefits of the platform. Some sites were designed to provide the program information for the conference, and some use the submissions feature to manage conference abstracts or even full-text papers. All sites are archived in Scholar Commons.

ETD Collection

The Electronic Theses & Dissertations (ETDs) in Scholar Commons is one of the largest and most heavily used portions of the repository. There are 5,450 ETDs currently in the collection, which have been used a total of 3,561,822 times. Rather than having to request a print copy of a dissertation through interlibrary loan, ETDs are easily discoverable online through the repository. Our ETDs are harvested by the Networked Digital Library of Theses and Dissertations (NDLTD) and are preserved in the Digital Commons Private LOCKSS Network.

With some department departures and technical issues, the upload of ETDs was delayed this year. However, despite these challenges, Scholar Commons has able to add 213 graduate student works in the past year.

Journal Collection

Scholar Commons now hosts fifteen journals in the USF institutional repository, with two more in progress. These open access journals allow researchers across the world 24/7 access to research that has traditionally kept behind a subscription firewall or limited to a few physical print copies. Twelve of our journals are peer-reviewed, keeping to the same quality standards as traditional journals. One of our journals, *International Journal of Speleology*, is in Scopus and has an impact factor.

Subject matter is varied, ranging from geology to homeland security to the humanities. Nine titles are in the Global LOCKSS Network, with the remaining 6 titles being preserved in the Digital Commons Private LOCKSS Network. This ensures that this content is available even if something were to happen to the repository itself.

Periodically, and as requested, statistics for all journals are pulled and analyzed. For our top journals, we are able to pull additional Google Analytics. To help increase all journals' statistics, we provide periodic announcements through Facebook and Twitter for launching journals, recent issues, and calls for submissions.

The central Scholar Commons email is consistently monitored for journal activity and forwarded as needed. Assistance and training for journal editors are provided as requested.

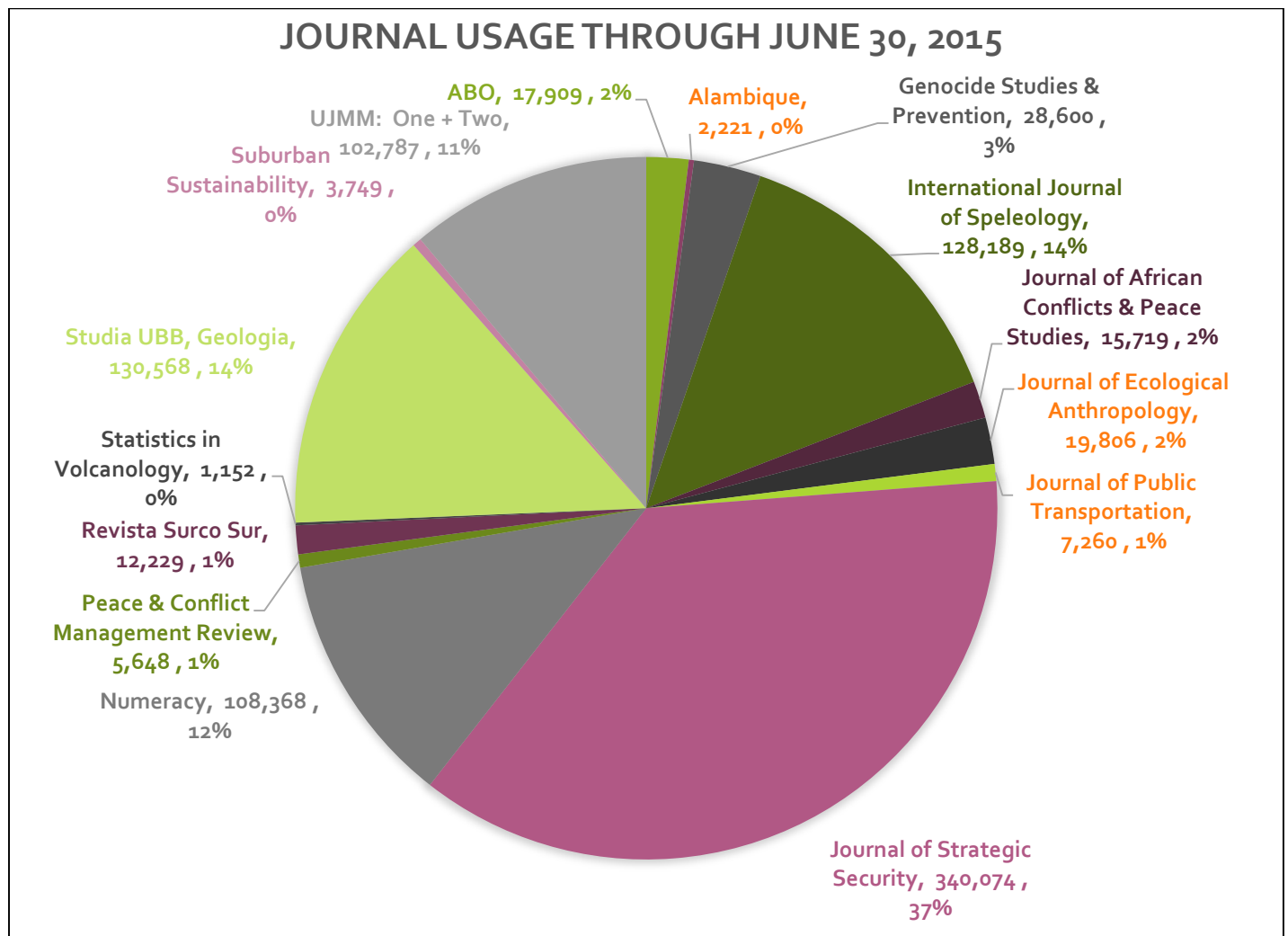

Statistics

Full-text downloads for Scholar Commons have grown 45 percent from 3,481,956 to 5,061,597. While we were not able to continue doubling the number of items in the repository, high download trends have continued.

Open access academic journals, the original reason for the creation of this initiative, have consistently added new content. The addition of *Journal of Public Transportation*, with back content, also helped to increase the journal content count. When comparing download counts, many of our journals have more than doubled the number of full-text downloads versus last year.



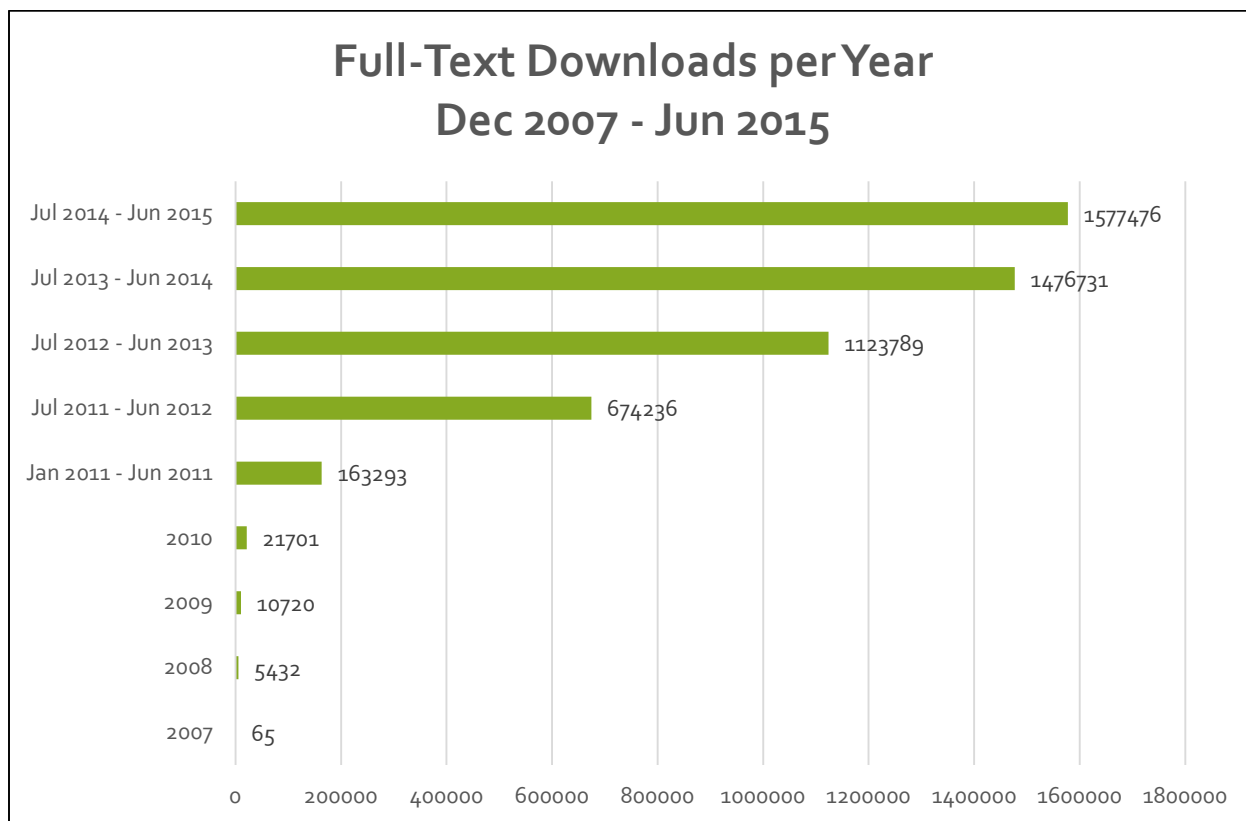
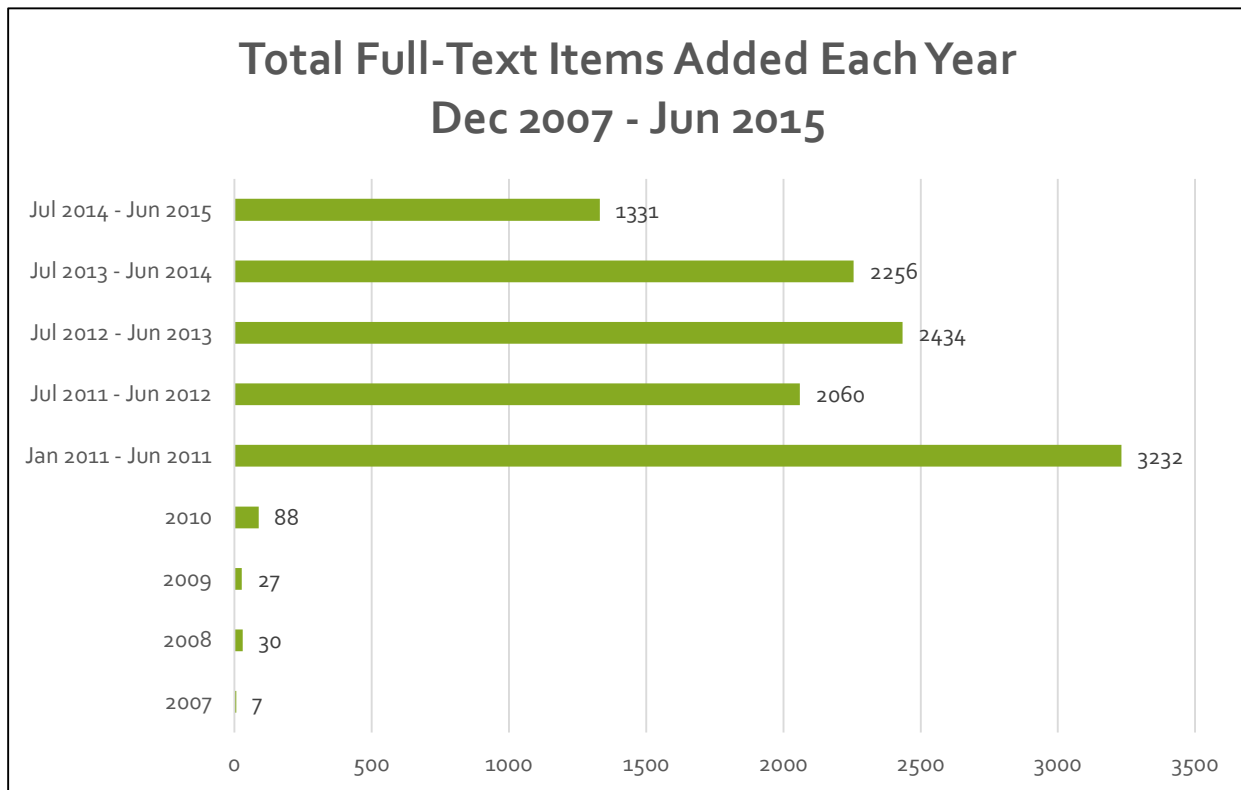
As in 2013-2014, the top downloaded item for 2014-2015 is Anol Bhattacharjee’s OA textbook, *Social Science Research: Principles, Methods, and Practices*. Dr. Bhattacharjee’s textbook was added to Scholar Commons in 2011. This item has now had 203,964 full-text downloads (as of our 2013-2014 report, it had been accessed 98,754 times). This is a 106% increase from last fiscal year. While the total downloads may not put OA Textbooks as the most heavily used series, individual items within this collection have received some of our highest usage.

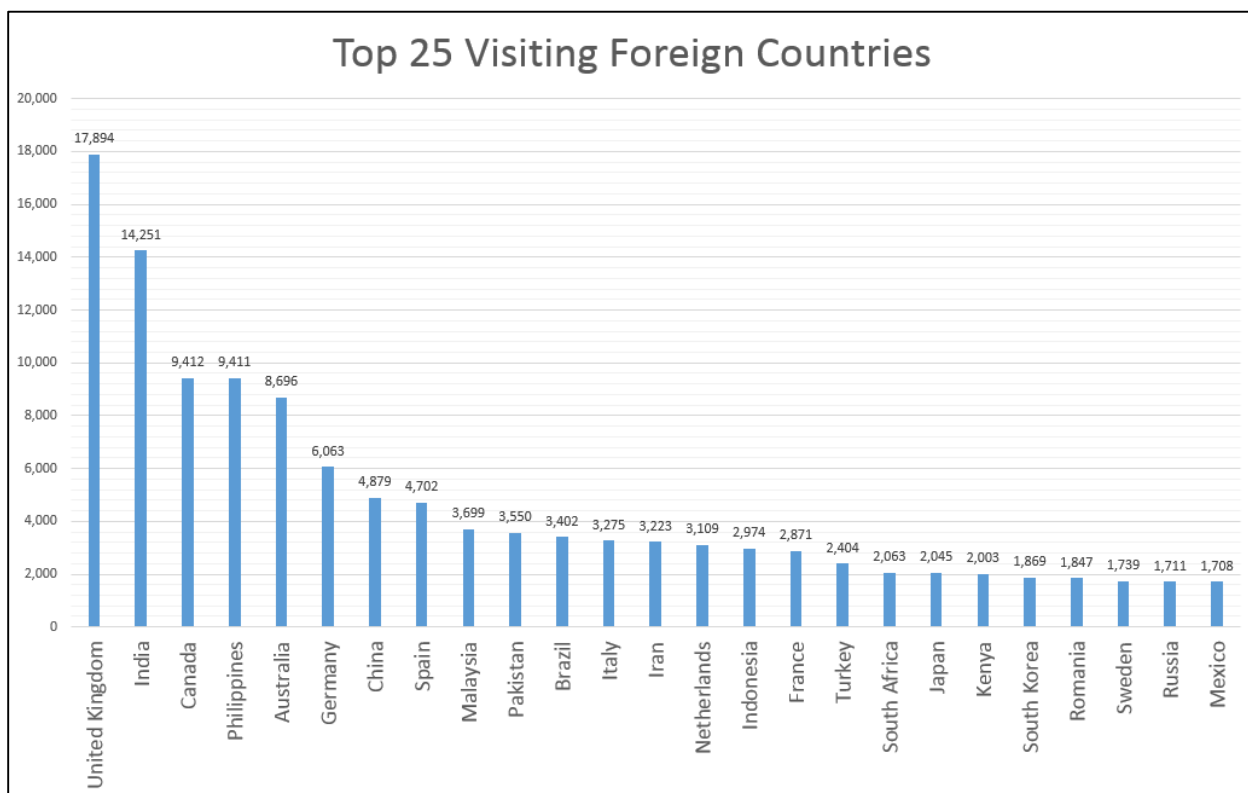

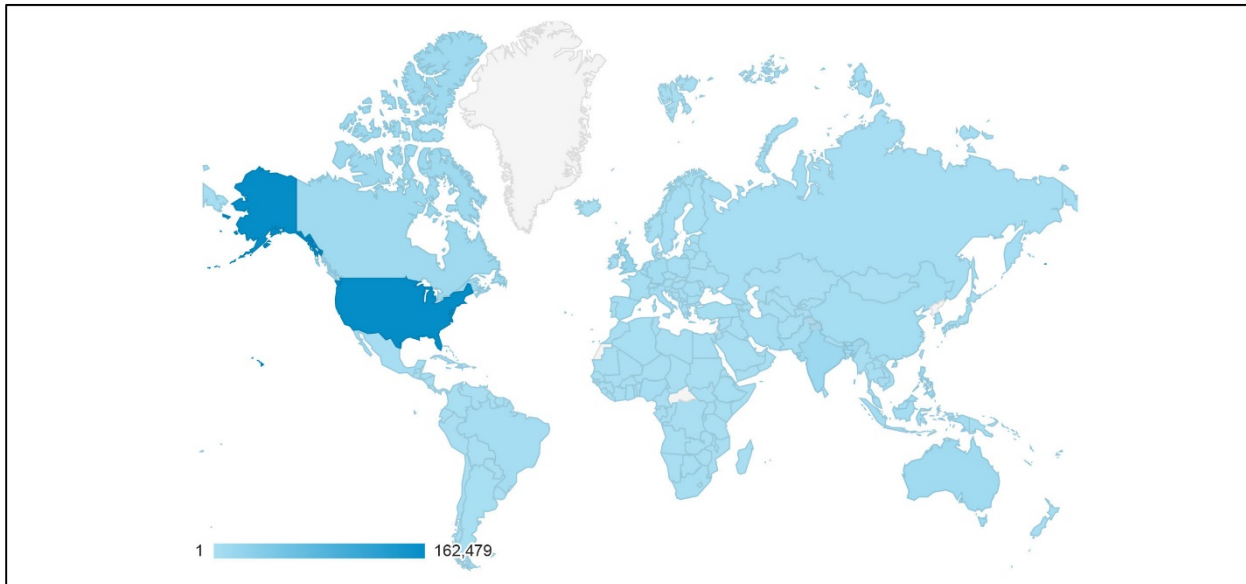

The past fiscal year brought 325,380 visitors to our site pages, with 260,647 being unique users. This is a 20% increase from last fiscal year's figures. Our returning user rate stayed steady at just over 20%, with the average visit duration lasting around 00:01:30, and each user is still viewing 2+ pages. Looking at where the referral traffic is coming from (like Google Scholar, Office of Graduate Studies site, OATD, Wikipedia, and Facebook), we can see that our marketing and promotion efforts are driving traffic to our site.

While the majority of our users are from the U.S. with English language settings, we receive visitors from over 200 countries/territories using over 175 different language settings. Detailed traffic patterns show that our foreign visitors continue to view more than just the ETD collection.

On October 10, 2011, information was submitted for our inclusion in the Ranking Web of World Repositories (now called Ranking Web of Repositories). For the first review after our inclusion, Scholar Commons sat at 603 of 1518 world repositories.

In our previous annual report for FY 2013-2014, Scholar Commons' ranking was 307 of 1983. As of the 17th edition of the Ranking Web of World Repositories (January 2015), we are now ranked 105.

Conclusion

This past year has been filled with great challenges and greater accomplishments. Our ETD collection now holds over 5,362 student works, which continuously receive top rankings in our most downloaded items. By the end of June 2015 the contents of Scholar Commons included: 45 publication series, 35 faculty series, 15 academic journals, 2 galleries, 19 conferences, events and lectures, 1 oral history series, 3 student works series (including the ETD series filtered into 73 sub-series), 4 book series, and 2 data series.

Challenges

- Many publishers will only allow the pre- or post-print versions of articles to be reposted on institutional repositories. However, most authors do not retain these versions of their works. This limits our ability to add full-text articles to Scholar Commons. We actively work to educate authors on the different formats possible for their work, and encourage them to retain more than one format in the future.
 - The lack of digital content occasionally forces us to search for physical items to digitize. However, the time to digitize items further delays posting. Additionally, the converted final product may not always be full-text or high-quality.
 - We ask our authors to provide the physical items of anything they have available that we have permission to post.
 - Publisher response times hinder progress. Depending on the publisher, we may receive a response back in a few days or a few months. Some do not respond at all.
 - We request help from USF librarians to speed up this process.
 - We do not have full participation of USF faculty.
 - With only a slight impact on total percentage, we had a few faculty complete self-submissions or request assistance from us. Working with the larger USF Academic Resources, we hope to complete the transfer of the FAIR Vita Bank, which will greatly increase the percentage of faculty participation.
 - There is some confusion between SelectedWorks and Scholar Commons. The Library supports both bepress products but they can seem like separate entities. Explaining how an institutional repository is different than a faculty profile should be a point of focus in the future.
 - Bepress is currently working on a new version of SelectedWorks, to be implemented in Fall 2015, to improve integration between the two systems.
 - Local self-archiving of faculty publications contradicts our preservation efforts and requires running personal or departmental web servers. This leads to duplication of academics' time and resources. Lack of essential back-ups, metadata, and maintenance creates poor records, increases security holes, and places the long-term preservation of materials at risk.
 - Last year we were able to bring in another journal that was running on an outside platform into Scholar Commons. We hope our efforts to work with the larger USF Academic Resources to include the Vita Bank will have a significant impact on this challenge.

Short-Term Goals

FY 2015-2016

- Complete CAS pilot project.
 - This project stalled after departure of the repository manager. As we rebuilt the Scholar Commons team, we worked hard to bolster the project. Currently, we are locating the contact email for the person or unit responsible for article (or book chapter) permissions. We are finished with the Geosciences collection, approximately 2/3 of the way through the Communications collection, and working our way through the Psychology collection.
- Contact one author from the last two colleges for permission to deposit their works into corresponding series within Scholar Commons.
- Finalize a process with the Office of Graduate Studies to transfer the ETD submission process from ProQuest to Scholar Commons.
- Finish getting the remaining DC PLN members live on the network and work with LOCKSS to make sure the remaining repository content is made available for harvesting.
- Complete the licensing process to become a participating publisher with Portico and send all available journal content to them for preservation in a dark archive.
- Bring the two journals in process to production and work with editors to help them publish their first issues.

Long-Term Goals

- Complete record of scholarly works produced by all USF faculty and staff.
- Complete record of all theses and dissertations produced by all USF master, specialist, and doctoral students.
- Identify and train administrators for Scholar Commons within each of the individual series.
