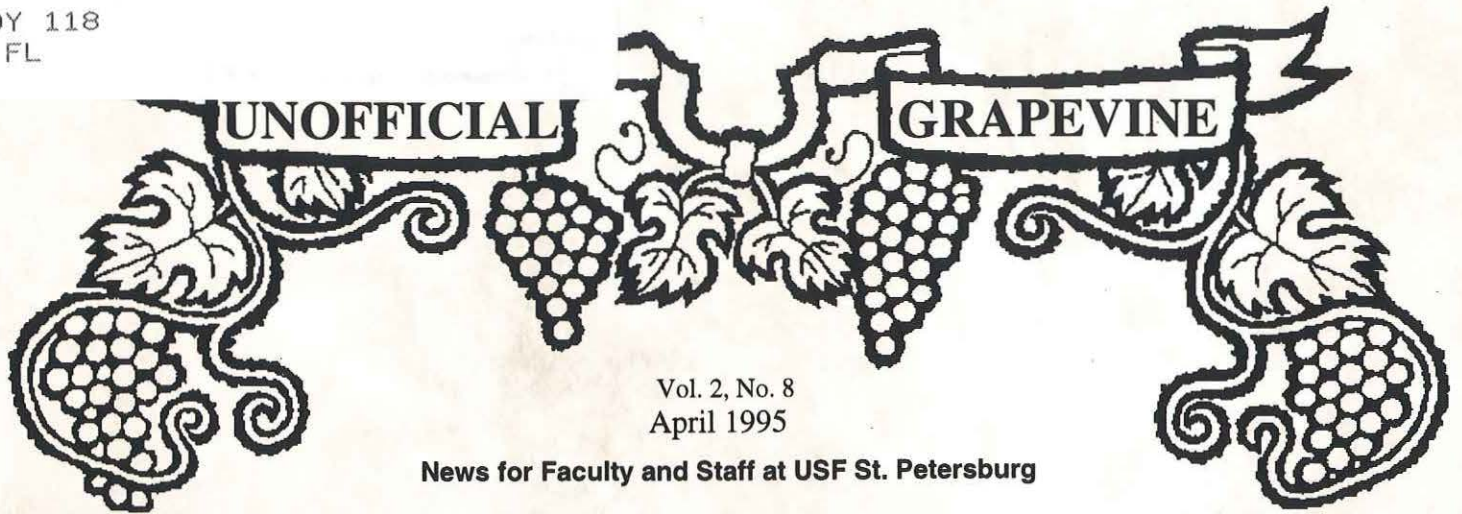

specifically designate a particular scholarship fund set up in Tampa).

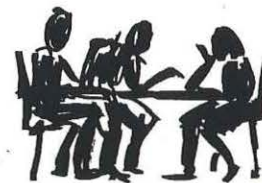
I want to thank Kim Stoddard for chairing our campaign this spring; we already have more than \$5,000 in gifts and pledges.
