Introduction to the Collection

Ron Brackett, a news director at the *St. Petersburg Times*, solicited letters to commemorate the sixtieth anniversary of the end of World War II. This collection includes submissions to the newspaper. Some of the materials in this collection appeared in a commemorative section published by the *St. Petersburg Times*.

Preservation Note

Provenance of the Remembering World War II Collection

This collection falls under the Journalism and Media Studies provenance of the Special Collections and Archives department, Nelson Poynter Memorial Library, USF St. Petersburg.

Scope and Contents

The materials in this collection occupy one acid-free document box (0.42 ln. ft.). The bulk of the collection includes correspondence. Some photographs, clippings, and other materials (including one CD-ROM) accompany letters submitted to the newspaper.

Related Collections

The *St. Petersburg Times* has previously donated three manuscript collections to the University of South Florida library system by that describe readers' memories of World War II. The Nelson Poynter Memorial Library owns two collections: "Remembering Pearl Harbor" (finding aid, December 1992), and "Remembering D-Day" (finding aid, August 1994). In addition, the USF Tampa library has the "World War II Letters Collection," a compilation of letters from readers who described where they were at the end of the war. Taken together, these smaller collections offer researchers a wide variety of vignettes from soldiers, families, friends, and others who have personal memories of the Second World War.
