facing the mortgage crisis A Florida Matters Special Edition The mortgage crisis is affecting the entire nation, and the Tampa Bay area is among the hardest hit regions. WUSF Public Broadcasting wants to connect residents in the Tampa Bay region with the trusted information and free services they need during this crisis through a new project: Facing the Mortgage Crisis: A Florida Matters Special. The Florida Matters team will examine how this nation's mortgage crisis has affected our region through personal accounts of homeowners currently going through foreclosures and with useful information to help homeowners at risk. This locally produced program is sponsored by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. The cable-based television news station, Bay News 9, has partnered with WUSF by contributing reports, and will simulcast the Florida Matters special on its own channel. Airs Friday, August 21, at 6 p.m., on WUSF 89.7 and at 8 p.m. on WUSF TV.



Exploring new horizons

t WUSF Public Broadcasting, we tapped in early to the potential of the digital revolution by adding three digital TV channels—Create TV, WUSF Kids and the Florida Knowledge Network—to enhance the programming on our main channel, WUSF TV. We wanted to take advantage of the digital transition to give our viewers access to more quality programming. But the recent digital transition has had some unintended consequences, leaving WUSF without a channel on Comcast's and Bright House Networks' basic cable tiers.

Recently, WUSF was given a choice by the cable providers to either provide our main channel only on

the basic tier until 2012, or to have all four of our channels included on the higher digital tier. Although we had a tough decision to make, we decided to keep all four channels to protect the future of WUSF Public Broadcasting.

We have received hundreds of calls and some of our viewers have cancelled their memberships since these changes occurred. We are sorry for the confusion this has created and we hope to gain back our viewers and members who have been lost in the digital transition. WUSF does not want anyone left behind and unable to find the programming they value so much.

We are making every effort to ensure that our viewers know how to find us. There are two primary ways to view WUSF TV on your television set. You can receive WUSF for free over the air using a digital tuner or converter box and antenna or you can find us on the digital tiers on cable (see our website for channel information). Both cable providers charge an additional fee of \$1 per month for this option and Comcast will waive the fee for the first 12 months. In addition, many of our programs are available on our website at wusf.org.

Now, more than ever, we depend on your support so we can continue to provide our awardwinning programming to all. Thank you for being a part of WUSF Public Broadcasting.


