### Jay Sokolovsky wins national award for innovative aging research

USF St. Petersburg Anthropology Professor [Jay Sokolovsky](#), Ph.D., has won a national award from the American Anthropological Association for his nearly four decades of groundbreaking research and leadership that led to the creation of a new area of study focused on aging. Sokolovsky, coordinator of the USFSP [Anthropology Program](#), will receive the 2013 Robert B. Textor and Family Prize for Excellence in Anticipatory Anthropology during the American Anthropological Association's annual meeting in November. The award honors contributions in anthropology that encourage informed policy choices. Before Sokolovsky began studying impoverished elders living in single room occupancy hotels in Midtown Manhattan in 1974, aging was not recognized as a subspecialty among anthropologists. Today the American Anthropological Association Interest Group on Aging and the Life Course which he helped found boasts 750 members.
