**Facing the Mortgage Crisis** 

The mortgage crisis is a perfect storm of economic and market forces, and that storm has battered the Tampa Bay area as much as any region in the country. At WUSF, we responded by partnering with Bay News 9 to provide resources, information and guidance to local families facing the possibility of foreclosure. Thanks to a grant from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, WUSF developed two *Florida Matters* specials (one on radio and one on TV) and a dedicated website offering a single source for people in our community looking for help. Both programs are available online at tampabaymortgagecrisis.org along with other helpful resources. In the months ahead, WUSF will continue to offer vital information on the crisis.
