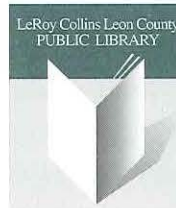

a moral wilderness.*

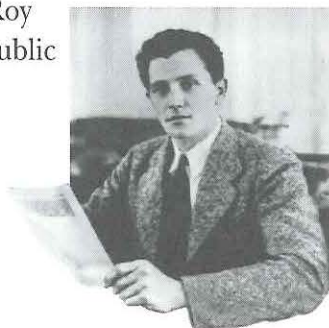


Governor LeRoy Collins' lifelong dedication to doing what was right helped
