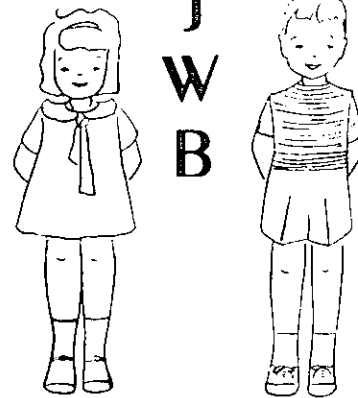

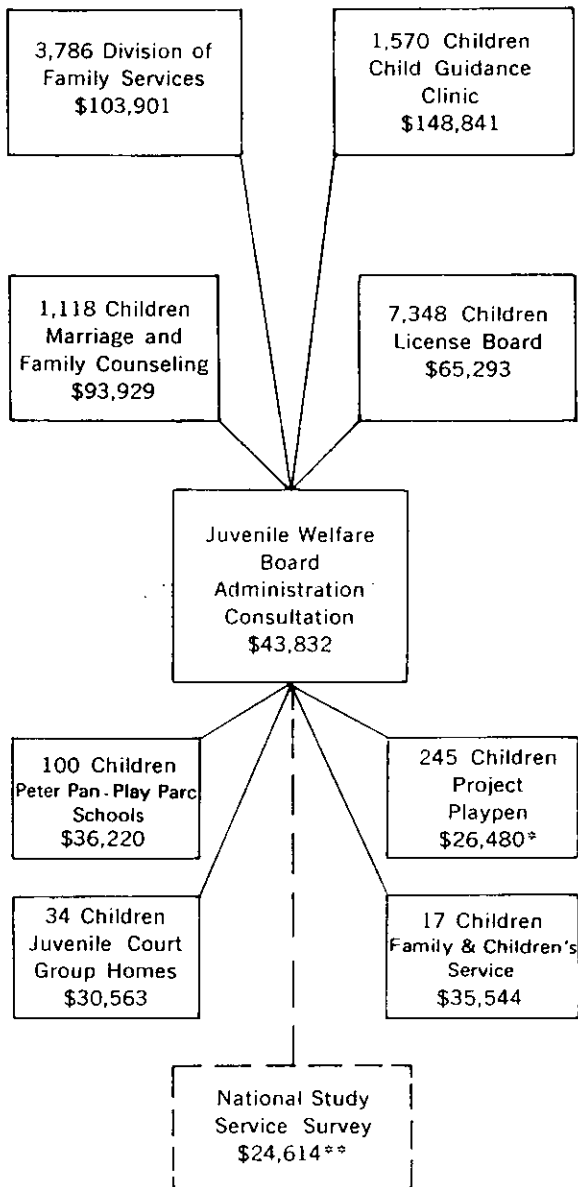

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



The primary 1971-72 Annual Report for the Juvenile Welfare Board is in the form of the accompanying Summary of the comprehensive social survey completed by the National Study Service. The survey procedure twice in the past has served the Board well. This study, entitled "The Welfare of Juveniles and Their Families in Pinellas County, Florida", will help the Juvenile Welfare Board evaluate the past quarter-century of services which have been provided to children. Even more important, this survey will be utilized to give direction to the future course of services to be supported or offered by the Board.

For the community, perhaps the most significant aspect of the Juvenile Welfare Board study is that it has been coordinated from the beginning with a companion study being done by the National Study Service, for the United Way of Pinellas County. Combining these two surveys with Project INSTEP (specifically relating to the needs of those citizens over 55) should provide Pinellas County with as complete a blueprint for coordination of services and effort as ever has been available at any one point in time. The funding was done in cooperation with the State Division of Family Services, which administers Title IV-A funds.

It is rewarding to be a part of the planning and leadership that this Board affords. Because of the study just completed, as a Board we plan to take even more vigorous leadership to extend help to all children possible. It has been the aim of the Board to pioneer, establish, develop and put in good working order worthy programs for children, and to this end we are always expanding and investigating new programs. This concept has served 14,218 children in Pinellas County in 1971-72. In 1972-73 we are looking forward to the implementation of many of the recommendations of the National Study Service survey. This, I know, will be exciting and far-reaching.
