

# New Directions

y now you can hear our newest efforts on your behalf; news and information with all night jazz on WUSF 89.7 and all classical WSMR 89.1. If you're having trouble hearing either station, learn about all the options for listening on wusf.org, your source for information about WUSF Public Media.

It took a lot of heavy lifting by our talented staff to make the changes that bring WUSF Public Media closer in tune with what our listeners and members have been requesting. Transmitters were moved, transmission lines were hung on the new Sarasota tower and on the USF Tampa campus tower. Program schedules were created, revised, and then recreated with a different order. Staff recorded special announcements about the changes, rehearsed the new call letters, prepared for launch. A small

transition team met each morning at 9:30 to review the activities underway and add new tasks to the list. Every WUSF staff member played an important role in making these changes.

It's not easy to change course, especially when everything seems to be going nicely. In some ways, we took the old WUSF for granted. It was a bulwark: popular enough to keep going, but with the capability of serving so many more listeners in its new configuration. Times have changed. In the past, any changes at WUSF were subtle. Now, we've rocked the boat and we'll be even better than before.

In case our staff didn't have enough extra work, our new journalism project launched. 


