Promising student research focuses on insider threats

Chris Brown wants to find the next Edward Snowden before he strikes. The USF St. Petersburg [College of Business](#) graduate student is researching a new way for government agencies and businesses to identify potential insider threats like Snowden, the former National Security Agency contractor who admitted leaking classified information. "The NSA has the ability to track what people do on computers but they're not making sense of all that data," Brown explains. Brown is working closely with Alison Watkins, USFSP professor of information systems and associate dean for graduate and certificate programs. They have published three research papers for national conferences and are in discussions with a major U.S. bank about testing the method.

St. Petersburg mayoral candidates appear at forum



More than 120 people turned out Tuesday for the [first mayoral forum](#) of the St. Petersburg general election, held at the [University Student Center](#). The forum, moderated by USFSP Political Science Professor Judithanne Scourfield McLauchlan, Ph.D., focused on economic development and small businesses and featured incumbent Mayor Bill Foster and challenger Rick Kriseman. It was the latest in a series of candidate forums sponsored by USF St. Petersburg. Frank Biafora, Ph.D., Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, will moderate televised forums at St. Petersburg City Council Chambers on Oct. 14 for Mayoral candidates and Oct. 16 for City Council candidates.
