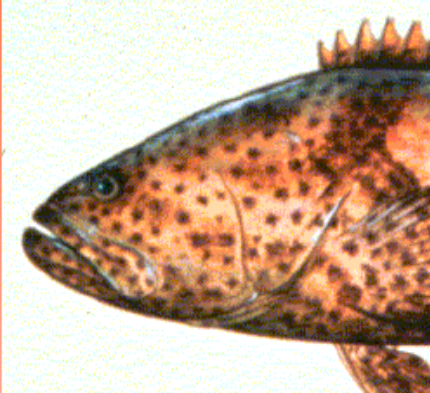

Eco Cruise: Marc Blouin

The Eco-Cruises are designed to bring environmental awareness to USF St. Petersburg. Working with U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and USF faculty, the Waterfront will be offering cruises around Tampa Bay waters aboard the Wanderer, a 37 foot sailboat. A maximum of ten participants are permitted for each cruise—a captain, a speaker, and eight "cruisers". No sailing or boating experience is required. Topics will include global warming, water pollution, or just about anything related to the environment! The cruise is open to students, staff, faculty, affiliates and alumni as well as the general public. Both midday and evening cruises will be offered.
