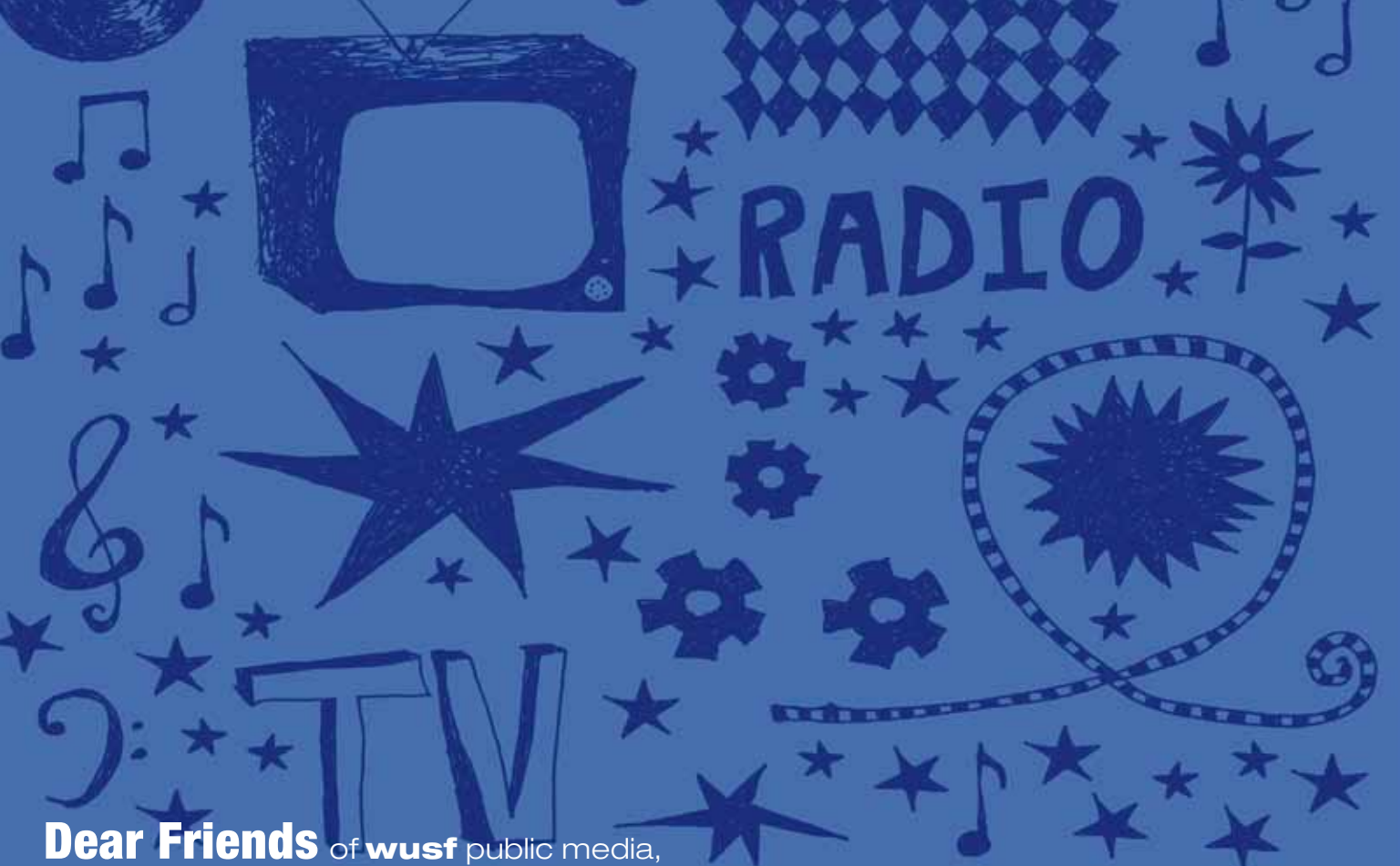

As you probably know, all state funding for public broadcasting was eliminated by the Governor on May 26, 2011. To WUSF, this means a loss of \$500,000.
