**Nova: Engineering Ground Zero** tells the epic story of engineering, innovation, and the perseverance of the human spirit, as it follows the five-year construction of One World Trade Center and the National September 11 Memorial and Museum. The documentary captures the behind-the-scenes struggle of architects and engineers to make the buildings safe and secure, and the public's expectations of a fitting site for national remembrance. **Airs Sunday, September 11, at 7 p.m.**

**America Remembers 9/11** explores the lasting effects that the terrorist attacks have had across the United States. This *PBS NewsHour* special features the *NewsHour* team as they visit with family members who lost loved ones, explore American Muslim insights, speak with young Americans, and visit a small town in California that has made extraordinary contributions, in terms of young lives lost, to the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan. **Airs Sunday, September 11, at 8 p.m.**

**Great Performances "New York Philharmonic 10th Anniversary Concert"** The New York Philharmonic, under the direction of Alan Gilbert, performs Mahler's Symphony No. 2, "Resurrection," in honor of the victims of September 11, 2001, at Avery Fisher Hall at Lincoln Center. WUSF 89.7 is featuring a series of special news programs to commemorate 9/11

**Florida Matters** will explore how the events of that day reshaped the people of Florida. WUSF's Carson Cooper will conduct a panel discussion about how 9/11 has changed our daily lives, from privacy issues to airport security to homeland security. **Florida Matters** airs **Tuesday, September 6, 6:30-7 p.m., and Sunday, September 11, 7:30-8 a.m., on WUSF 89.7, and Friday, September 9, 7-7:30 p.m., on WSMR 89.1.**

Throughout the week we'll also speak with the families of victims of the attacks, and we'll provide daily coverage of the services, events and memorials leading up to and including the September 11 anniversary during **Morning Edition** and **All Things Considered**. Reporter Steve Newborn will talk with students, teachers and others who were with President Bush in Sarasota when the attacks occurred. Bobbie O'Brien will explore how 9/11 changed lives and the military inside MacDill Air Force Base. **Morning Edition** airs each weekday from 5 a.m. to 9 a.m. and **All Things Considered** airs each weekday from 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.



**Nature's Power Revealed** Natural forces such as earthquakes, volcanoes and tsunamis are part of a vital process that has taken place since the birth of our planet, renewing and replenishing even as they destroy. Airs Thursdays at 9 p.m., September 1, 8 and 15.



**Lidia's Italy in America** Join chef and restaurateur Lidia Bastianich on a culinary journey across rural and urban America, as she reveals traces and sources of Italian culture through food, drink, art, music and fashion. Airs Sundays at 4:30 p.m., beginning September 11.



**Not In Our Town: Light in the Darkness** This film follows Mayor Paul Pontieri as he leads a diverse group of residents to confront the anti-immigrant bias in their town and repair the fabric of their community life. Airs Wednesday, September 21, at 10 p.m.
