Sir:

Reference is made to previous correspondence concern-
ing your desire to have your wife, Mrs. Josefa Oural and
children, Ramon and Melba, evacuated from Spain and returned
to the United States.

A telegram dated October 6, 1936, from the American Con-
sul at Vigo reports that owing to difficulty of arranging pas-
sage at Vigo, it is suggested that you arrange passage for
your family from Lisbon to New York. It is suggested there-
fore that you communicate with some steamship line at New
York and make the necessary arrangements for prepaid passage
for your family from Lisbon to New York.

If you will advise the Department when arrangements
have been made the American Consul at Vigo will be so in-
formed and will advise Mrs. Oural.
