Sir:

I have received your letter of October 14, 1936, enclosing a check in the amount of \$100 and requesting that it be transmitted to the American Consul at Vigo, Spain, for payment to Mrs. Josefa Oural. You state that you have been informed by Mr. Manuel Diaz Cao, a local agent for certain steamship companies in New York, that the Italiana Steamship Company of New York has telegraphed their agent in Spain to deliver to the American Consulate at Vigo, three prepaid tickets on the S.S. BOLCANIA, sailing on October 22, 1936, with the request that the tickets be delivered to Mrs. Josefa Oural. As stated in the Department's letter of October 7, 1936, the Consul at Vigo reported owing to the difficulty of arranging passage at Vigo it was suggested that you arrange passage for your family from Lisbon, Portugal. It is assumed, therefore, that passage has been arranged from Lisbon to New York.

A telegram has been sent to the American Consul at Vigo advising him of your deposit of \$100 and authorizing him to draw a separate draft in this amount and to pay the proceeds thereof to Mrs. Oural. The Consul has also been informed of the arrangements made for the transportation of your family to New York as indicated in your letter under acknowledgment. He has been requested to report when payment of the \$100 is made to Mrs. Oural and the date on which she contemplates sailing for the United States. Upon the receipt of a report from the Consul at Vigo you will be informed.
