#### **Introduction to the Collection**

This collection of materials was received from the Florida Humanities Council (FHC), a non-profit organization with headquarters at USF St. Petersburg. As the state affiliate for the National Endowment for the Humanities, FHC provides grants for public humanities programs and resources on a wide range of Florida topics.

This collection offers a valuable resource for researchers looking to gain insight on cultural, recreational, and educational projects and programs offered to the public throughout the state of Florida from 2001 to 2005. Items in this collection are resultant materials from programs funded (at least in part) by FHC grants. FHC sponsored program material included in this collection cover a diverse range of educational and cultural areas, including (but not limited to): African American, Latino American, and American Indian heritage; archaeology; various arts and performances; ecology; architecture; general local history; and literature.

Types of materials included in the collection are: local and regional magazines, news articles, brochures, posters, photographs, handouts, multimedia audio and digital items, and other ephemera. Items are organized and findable on two levels: by county, as well as by topic or program area (the former level contains program material that resulted from statewide or multicounty projects).

The collection was originally received by the library in August 2008, and was approximately 12.4 linear feet at the time of acquisition. Material removed from the collection consisted of internal documents; administrative grant paperwork; and resumes of grant participants, humanities scholars, and external program evaluators. Future accessions are expected.

#### **Preservation Note**

The contents of this collection are housed in four acid-free boxes. While preservation measures may slow the physical deterioration of archival materials, these steps cannot prevent damage from occurring. Please report any tears or other damage so that library staff may take appropriate preservation or conservation measures. Protective gloves should be worn when handling all photographs and three-dimensional objects. While no restrictions limit access to this collection, library staff will evaluate photocopying or digitization requests on an individual basis to ensure the long-term preservation of this unique collection. Patrons using this collection must adhere to copyright and fair-use guidelines and provide proper citation of sources appearing in their research.
