Annual Review Guidelines

A copy of this document was distributed with the meeting agenda. This policy was reviewed and approved by the Faculty Council with the stipulation that colleges may adapt the annual review process as needed as long as the overall process complies with these USFSP guidelines.

It was also suggested that the timetable in the USFSP Annual Review Guidelines be amended to say that the review packets will be sent to the College Dean's offices rather than the VP's office by February 28. This will allow better access to the documents by the college review committees.

USFSP Award for Teaching Excellence

Faculty Grievances

A copy of the USF temporary rule for grievances was included with the meeting agenda. Steve Micklo has been elected as the faculty representative to a grievance committee should it be needed. Although much of this policy is still under debate because of the union contract expiration, it was suggested that it would be useful to have a clear, USFSP interpretation of the grievance policy.

Faculty Scholarship Colloquium

Gary Olson has proposed a faculty scholarship colloquium. It was noted that it would be very useful to have some better coordination of the faculty lectures that are already taking place on campus (the ethics luncheons, marine science seminars, science journalism lectures, etc.)

Faculty council terms and elections
