**Florida Wildlife Corridor Expedition: Everglades to Okefenokee**  
A special WUSF presentation about a remarkable journey through Florida.

**I**n 2012, a group of explorers, including bear biologist Joe Guthrie, conservationist Mallory Lykes Dimmitt, photojournalist Carlton Ward Jr., and filmmaker Elam Stoltzfus, undertook a 100-day, 1,000-mile journey through the Florida wilderness — from the Everglades to the Georgia border. The expedition was designed to increase public awareness and generate support for the Florida Wildlife Corridor project. The group traversed the wildlife habitats, watersheds and participating working farms and ranches that comprise the Florida Wildlife Corridor. The program documents this remarkable journey and the people the group met along the trek, including landowners, celebrities, conservationists, and politicians. “This was a once-in-a-life-time opportunity to showcase the landscapes, wildlife habitats, winding waterways and conservation legacies of Florida,” says Stoltzfus. “Experiencing the wilds of Florida was like an epic dream come true.” **Airs Thursday, March 28, at 8 p.m.**
