"I teach courses in maths," says **Dr. Mark Gaulter** , Assistant Professor of Mathematics. Mark Gaulter, son of Brian Gaulter, a famous United Kingdom math educator, came to the United States in 1994 after graduating from Cambridge University in England to study mathematics at the University of California, Santa Barbara. With his distinct English accent he is happy to discuss the characteristic vectors of unimodular lattices over the integers with his students. This research in number theory is unique in the field of mathematics. The breadth of courses Dr. Gaulter teaches includes calculus to algebra with a specialty graduate course in quadratic forms.

When children have recurrent trouble sleeping, their families must deal with negative effects on behavior, mood, social interactions, physical stamina and performance at school or work.
