**Committee/Division Updates**

*Student Affairs (Colleen Gray):* There will be a division meeting at Fort Desoto in June.

*Chief of Police Search (Terri Johnson):* The current Chief, Bob Siwik, will retire in June. There were 90 applicants and was narrowed down to 4 strong applicants.

*Leadership Meeting (David Brodosi):* There will be 228 students walking at commencement. Tickets are sold out.

*Student Life Committee (Sue Ryan):* Recommended for Greek Life. Student Union should be complete in 2006.

**Council Election Results**

**Student Union/Resident Housing**

Mike Williams explained different fee structures for students to fund the student union/resident housing.

Option A: \$95 fee plus \$7.50 per credit hour.

Option B: \$60 fee plus \$8 per credit hour.

Option C: \$40 fee plus \$16 per credit hour.

Every option was explored in the decision making process and in the end option C was selected. This still must be approved by the Board of Trustees.

A survey was sent out prior and the response was 8% (387 out of 4700 sent out was returned)

As of now, there are no plans for a tuition increase for the fall 2004 semester.

### **Construction Projects**

Abdul Nassar gave a presentation on proposed construction projects.

- Student housing (Fall 2006 occupancy)
  - The 1<sup>st</sup> phase will be a 4-5 story building that will have 250-300 beds.
  - This would be in the B1 or B1 & B2 areas (NE quadrant of campus) of the campus master plan.
  
- Multipurpose Student Center
  - The building will be 74,000 gross sq. ft./ 48,000 net sq. ft.
  - Total debt will be \$16.8 million
  - 30 years @ 6%
  
- Parking Garage
