Actions

The individual committee members agreed to work within their separate discipline to insure summer schedules were profitable. Kearns agreed to send each member a spreadsheet by discipline with the current summer schedule and the revenue and costs for each scheduled class.

Kearns stated that he did not agree with how overheads were calculated for the costs. First, overheads were applied as a percentage of the salary whereas, in reality, overheads were fixed per class and did not vary with the salary. Second, Tampa and Sarasota do not include overheads in calculating the profitability of the course. Third, revenues did not reflect the true revenue generated by the class as a significant portion was first allocated back to the campus. Thus, the class was only credited with a portion of the tuition.

Approval of March 20, 2014 Meeting Minutes

Summer Teaching

The CBC has been asked to formulate guidelines for which courses will be offered this summer.

In Summer 2014 teacher salaries will be based upon 12.5 percent of the regular annual salary. To this must be added 16.5 percent for benefits and 15 percent for overheads. Together this is 16.44 percent (or, 12.5% plus (16.5% + 15%) x 12.5%).

Revenue for courses will be in-state tuition per credit hour x no. of credit hours plus pertinent fees. For 3-hour courses this will be:

$\$193.70 \times 3 = \$581/\text{undergrad student}$

$\$460 \times 3 = \$1,380/\text{grad student}$

For rough estimates, a table is attached for course income and instructor expense.

Other items that affect the decision: seniority, classes that prerequisites for graduation, etc.

Standards for Faculty Qualifications

FQ (handout) has been updated to reflect all suggested changes. The FQ will be sent to all faculty on April 11 for approval at the April 25 COB faculty meeting.
