"Behind the Wall" is a documentary based on Jerry Rawicki's memories of his childhood in Poland and his life as a Jew in Europe during World War II. The film evolved from his conversations with Distinguished University Professor Carolyn Ellis, Department of Communications, at USF Tampa.

USFSP to Host 16th Times Reading Festival

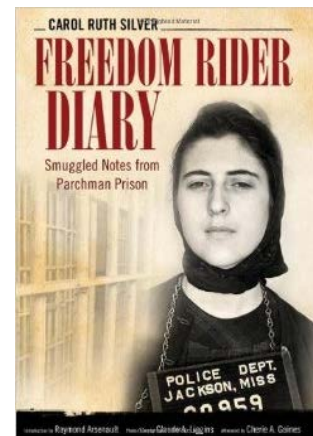
On Saturday, the USFSP campus will be transformed into the main stage for authors, writers, students and community as they gather for the 16th Annual Tampa Bay Times Reading Festival.

Well-known Florida novelist, Carl Hiaasen, will participate in the festival this year, alongside best-selling suspense-novelist Michael Koryta and famous young adult horror author, R.L. Stine. Dr. Tony Silvia, USFSP Journalism professor, also will contribute as an author, highlighting his journey through the writing of his new book: *Robert Pierpoint: A Life at CBS News*.

USFSP's Dr. Ray Arsenault, who won three national Emmy awards for his documentary on the Freedom Riders, will introduce author and civil rights attorney, Carol Ruth Silver. Silver, a Freedom Rider herself, has authored a book about her experiences: *Freedom Rider Diary: Smuggled Notes from Parchman Prison*.

"This is a special day for the community and USFSP," said Dr. Han Reichgelt, regional vice chancellor of Academic Affairs. "I'm delighted to see our faculty featured on the roster."

Construction of SunSense Solar Array Underway

As construction gets underway on USFSP's new SunSense solar array, Sustainability Coordinator Jennifer Winter was invited to discuss the project with Bay News 9's Al Reuchel. Winter and Tamara Waldman, Duke Energy's renewable energy director, talked about what the \$1 million grant-funded project means to USFSP.

"Students are learning about the next power source and how it relates to sustainability," said Winter. "SunSense is a great opportunity for students to understand the electricity behind the switch."

Over the summer, Duke Energy Florida awarded USFSP a \$1 million dollar SunSense grant that will fund research to explore the integration of storing solar energy in new battery systems. As part of the grant, a 100 kW solar photovoltaic (PV) system will be installed on the top of the University's 5th Avenue South parking garage. Construction begins this weekend.

The USFSP Campus Police Department has a new Emergency Operations Center (EOC), complete with multiple interactive screens, access to weather radar, security cameras, maps and databases.

"This is the room in which we'll manage special events and emergencies, any crisis," said Chief David Hendry. "The technology allows us to cover a lot of ground."

The Incident Management Team, which includes members from departments across campus, will meet regularly in the new EOC.

Boyer Delivers "State of Student Body"

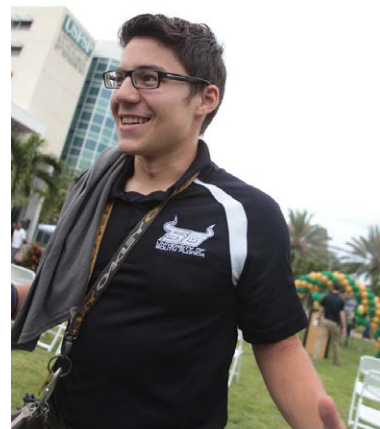
