USFSP Online MBA Ranked 32 in Nation



KTCOB Interim Dean Gary Patterson announced the ranking at a recent gathering of the faculty.

U.S. News & World Report ranked the Online MBA Program at USFSP among the nation's top 20-percent in its 2015 survey of Best Online MBA Programs. Of 195 universities, USFSP is ranked #32 in the nation and #2 in Florida behind the University of Florida. The rankings were based on five general categories: Student Engagement, Admissions Selectivity, Peer Reputation, Faculty Credentials and Training, and Student Services and Technology. USFSP's program scored especially well in Faculty Credentials and Training, in which it tied at #6 nationally.

"This is indeed an honor and a testament to the hard work and dedication of the talented faculty and staff at our Kate Tiedemann College of Business," said Regional Chancellor Sophia Wisniewska. "Our program's success is rooted in the flexibility and convenience it offers, particularly for working professionals. This AACSB-accredited program is also grounded in a tradition of quality, with online courses that are

taught by the same highly-credentialed faculty who teach our graduate courses on campus."

The 3rd Annual St. Petersburg Conference on World Affairs returns to campus February 26-28 and will again tackle critical international issues. Panels of experts will discuss everything from the rise of ISIS to immigration reform.

"This year's conference, as always, will focus on the most timely issues of the day," said Dr. Thomas Smith, director of the USFSP Honors Program and a conference founder. "Panelists will address geopolitical issues of Syria, Cuba, and Ukraine, as well as the challenges of climate change, infectious diseases, and women's rights."



This year's conference will feature more than 30 impressive speakers. Wole Soyinka, winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1986, will be among them. Soyinka's works have been widely translated, his plays performed internationally. He is active on both artistic and human rights organizations such as the International Theatre Institute, the UN Commission on
