The USF St. Pete Lecture Series Committee is sponsoring a talk by DR. ALAN BRINKLEY on "John Kennedy, Lyndon Johnson, and the Triumph of Liberalism." The lecture will be on Wednesday, May 23, in Bayboro Hall, Room 130. It begins at 7:30 PM and is free.

Dr. Brinkley's book Voices of Protest, tracing the power and prominence of Huey Long and Father Charles Coughlin during the Great Depression, won the American Book Award for History in 1983. He also co-authored America in the Twentieth Century (Fifth Edition) with Frank Freidel.

Dr. Brinkley graduated from Princeton University in 1971 and received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from Harvard University. Formerly an assistant professor of history at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, he currently teaches history at Harvard.
