II. Message from the Chancellor

Chancellor Wisniewska reports that the College of Education has raised more in external funding than any other college. She also encourages Strategic Planning and offers support for NCATE Accreditation visit.

III. Message from Interim Vice Chancellor

Dr. Fueyo reports that the College of Education "Service" is marvelous. She requests the tenured faculty to mentor junior faculty and help provide research support.

IV. Message from Associate Regional Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs

Dr. Julie Wong, introduces the Student Affairs team and explains their vision, mission and values. She reports that Student Affairs is here to support students, faculty, and staff.

V. Message from the Dean

Budget:

The College of Education Budget for 2013-2014 academic year is in process. All travel will be approved on a case by case basis.

Searches:

The college has been approved to conduct and fill a full-time faculty position for Math Education and Science Education.

Enrollment:

Enrollment is up on all levels, as well as, at PHCC.

VI. New Assessment System, Dr. Zafer Unal:

Dr. Unal reports and trains faculty on the new in-house assessment system (The Folio) which will track the completion of FEAP and ESOL competencies.

VII. NACTE/CAEP Requirements

VIII. Common Core update; Dr Anne Marie Gunn and Dr. Charles Vanover

A. Adjunct Modules:

Dr. Gunn reports on the development of the Common Core Modules, which all adjuncts will need to complete and pass. This module will fulfill the requirement from the FL DOE which requires all educators to demonstrate the awareness of the Common Core State Standards. To document your awareness, an orientation course with a mandatory quiz has been developed in Canvas.

B. PARCC:

Dr. Vanover shows slides on FCAT scores and the decrease in school scores. In addition he shows slides on PARCC Assessment design, overview, and advantages.

IX. New Concentration in Communication Sciences and Disorders

Dr .Brice reports on the collaboration with Arts and Science to offer new concentration in the B.S. Health and Science degree program. The concentration will enable students receive their degree and lead to Florida speech-language pathology assistant (SLPA) certification. All course credit and FTE will go to the COE.

X. Update on COE Website

Dr. Duker updates the College of Education on the launch of the new College of Education website which will be the end of October. He reports that the COE website will introduce student bloggers.
