



#### Introduction to the Collection

This collection consists of more than 450 panels of the "Muggs and Skeeter" cartoon drawn by Wallace Bond "Wally" Bishop, a longtime resident of St. Petersburg. Wally Bishop and his wife, Louise C. Bishop became leaders in a variety of social circles and cultural organizations in the greater St. Petersburg area. In the late 1930s, they bought the elaborate mansion constructed by C. Perry Snell on Brightwaters Boulevard at the mouth of Coffee Pot Bayou. In Louise's later life, her profound concern for ethics in undergraduate education led to the establishment of the Bishop Center for Ethical Leadership and Civic Engagement at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg. The cartoons in this collection, part of the Bishop estate, were transferred to the Bishop Center with hopes that they may support the didactic and curricular needs of the Center. After discussions with Dr. Bill Heller and David O'Neill of the Bishop Center, Special Collections and University Archives took physical possession of these documents on 9 September 2014. This finding aid includes the initial accession of materials in the collection. At some point in the future, excerpts from this collection may also become available in the USFSP Digital Archive.

# Provenance of the "Muggs and Skeeter" Cartoon Collection

This collection falls under the Journalism and Media Studies provenance of Special Collections and University Archives, Nelson Poynter Memorial Library, USF St. Petersburg.

## **Scope and Contents**

The contents occupy 1.35 linear feet. Although the cartoon appeared in newspapers from 1927 through 1974, all cartoons included in this collection are from 1962 or later. Some proof sheets include nearly entire weeks, though others are missing substantial portions of the cartoon strip, such as individual panels. Language of publication is American English. Although no restrictions prohibit access to this collection, photography, photocopying, or other reproduction of images requires permission of Special Collections and University Archives, Bishop Center staff, and other entities, as required by the terms of the deed of gift.

**Wallace Bond "Wally" Bishop** was born in Normal, IL. He first visited St. Petersburg in 1928 and later moved here from New York City. Known as one of the deans among American cartoonists, he drew the comic strip "*Muggs and Skeeter*" for 49 years.

Mr. Bishop was influenced early by "The Gumps" creator and fellow townsman, Sidney Smith. A summer as a copy boy was followed by enrollment in the American Academy of Arts in Chicago.

After his move to St. Petersburg, he became a prominent member of St. Petersburg's sports, art and dramatic circles.

Not only was he a versatile cartoonist, but Mr. Bishop was a showman as well. In his early days, he worked occasionally as a drummer, emceed numerous charity and benefit shows, and gave "chalk talks" about his art.

Mr. Bishop was also an avid sportsman. He enjoyed tennis and golf, however, sailing was his passion. As a life member of the International Lightening Class Association, he was active in the Southern Ocean Racing Circuit (SORC). In 1935, he won fame in yachting circles when he placed second in the St. Petersburg to Havana race while piloting the 25 foot Little Dipper.

He served his country in the Coast Guard as a flier during World War II and was later transferred to the Navy, serving in both the Atlantic and Pacific theaters. He left the service as a Lieutenant commander.

Mr. Bishop took an active interest in the community. He was a founder and board member of the St. Petersburg Museum of Fine Arts. He served on the boards of the United Fund (Way) and the American Red Cross. He served St. Anthony's Hospital as an Anthonian.

He was a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Arts, London, England.

Mr. Bishop was a member of numerous social and charitable organizations including the St. Petersburg-Tampa professional chapter of Sigma Delta Chi, St. Petersburg Yacht Club, Dragon Club, and the Bath Club of Redington Beach. He was also a member of the Evansville Elks Club, Evansville Country Club, National Cartoonists Society, Artists and Writers Clubs of New York City, and the Founders Club of the University of Evansville.

Louise C. Bishop was a longtime philanthropist who gave generously to important community projects in St. Petersburg. She held a special affection for the St. Petersburg Museum of Fine Arts, where a gallery is named after her and her husband. She was a major benefactor of the Florida Orchestra as well as the University of South Florida St Petersburg (USFSP). In recognition of her many gifts, the Florida Orchestra presented Mrs. Bishop with its Golden Baton Award in 1992. She had been a member of the Orchestra Guild since its commencement in 1963 as the St. Petersburg Symphony Guild. The University of South Florida St. Petersburg created the Center for Ethical Leadership which was named in honor of her and her husband

— The Bishop Center.

Born Louise Carson in Evansville, IN, she studied at Ferry Hall Prep, Lake Forest, IL and majored in piano at King-Smith Studio School, Washington, DC. She had wintered in St. Petersburg with her parents for many years, and on one of those occasions she was introduced to Mr. Wallace Bond "Wally" Bishop, whose *Muggs and Skeeter* comic strip was nationally syndicated and once ran in the *St. Petersburg Times*. She and Mr. Bishop married in 1936 at her parents' home in Evansville, IN.

In 1938, the Bishops bought and began the restoration of Perry Snell's Italianate Villa on Brightwaters Boulevard as they continued their active and generous participation in the St. Petersburg community and its civic organizations. Mrs. Bishop gave generously of her time and treasure to many worthy charities and endeavors. A few of her favorites included the Bishop Day Center located at the Pinellas Association for Retarded Children, St. Anthony's Hospital Foundation, St. Petersburg Museum of Art, and the Great Exploration Children's Museum.

Mrs. Bishop's involvement in St. Petersburg's many civic organizations enhanced and promoted her concern for the development of ethics and leadership in undergraduate college students. This concern encouraged her to provide substantial funding through an endowment for The Bishop Center for Ethical Leadership and Civic Engagement.

#### **Contextual Information about the Collection**

The cartoonist, Wallace Bond "Wally" Bishop (1905-1982), began the comic strip in 1927 under the name of "Muggs McGinnis." The name changed in 1936 to "Muggs and Skeeter" and became a staple if the cartoon pages until the strip ended publication in 1974. The proofs that exist in this particular collection span the years from 1962 through 1974. Missing from this collection are the years from 1927 through 1961. The cartoon's lifespan covers much of the midtwentieth century, including major historical events such as the end of the Roaring Twenties, the Great Depression, World War II, the Korean War, the assassinations of both President John F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King, the Vietnam War, Civil Rights protests, White House sit-ins, the Watergate Scandal, and much more.

Many of the comic strips are based on current events of the time. While it was not found to be the norm throughout the publishing life of the cartoon, the author did occasionally insert subtle references to his own feelings toward contemporary events. Indeed, there are three particular comics that one could construe as the author's way of mildly adding his political opinions; they took place during the tenure of President Richard Nixon. The first one dated June 1971 references citizens under watch and control of their government. The second one dated February/March 1972 refers to the desire for a new president, while the third, dated April 1972, mentions "invasion of privacy." These three comics actually reference a time when citizens strongly challenged governmental abuse of power and attempts to control the lives of ordinary citizens.

This comic actually places the grandparents as the primary caregivers to Muggs and Skeeter. There are references made that allude to the fact that at least the father is part of the lives of Muggs and Skeeter. For example, one of Skeeter's friends asks if the place where his father works is automated, or if his father caught any fish on his vacation, but the grandparents are the characters that Muggs and Skeeter are featured interacting with, asking if they can take Judo lessons, discussing report card grades, being told by the Grandmother that neither is to leave the house until their room is clean, etc. It makes the reader wonder if Muggs, Skeeter and their father live with the grandparents, and perhaps the mother, for whatever reason, is not in the picture at all. At a time when most comic strips—such as "Family Circus"—emphasized the family as a nuclear unit, "Muggs and Skeeter" offered a different approach to addressing the family.

The proofs themselves were created from two different paper sources: pulp, and a better grade, non-pulp. The majority of the non-pulp paper used is dated beginning in 1971, although some pulp was still being used. Overall, these proof sheets measured 8" x 16" with some minimal variances in sheet size. Some of the pieces inventoried were parts of the whole; meaning that they consisted of anywhere between one day's worth of the comic to five days. Sometimes these had been cut from the top of the sheet while in other cases from the bottom. There was only one instance where a seven-day week proof was present in the inventory, and it was only once found that the cartoons for one day of a run had actually been reused, although the conversation within those boxes changed. Several of the proof sheets were marked with numbers at that stop indicating "sets," and there were many duplicate sheets found within the collection. It is not known what the purpose of the comic boards was. Markings on them appear to be grammar checks, references made to previous run dates, and there are a couple that had

some words removed and replaced. There is still a considerable amount of investigative research that could follow. For example, additional research is required to understand if the change in the paper source was the result of a change in industry standards or not.

While there are some of conversations one might expect to take place between kids, the majority of the conversations actually comprise current events, leading one to believe that the author's intention was to keep his readers informed as to what was going on around them. For example, there are various conversations about littering, air pollution, noise pollution, the gasoline shortage, the Supreme Court's ruling on the death penalty, wiretapping and the invasion of privacy, etc. Additionally, the missing years could shed further light on Wally Bishop's political stance as it spans many historical events that would have likely been mentioned in the comic as has been demonstrated in this collection. As such, this type of project could potentially serve as an educational tool, particularly useful to persons who are not of the age to remember these events.
