On Feb. 24, the [USF St. Petersburg Police Department](#) celebrated a milestone, when it was recognized by the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) as a fully-accredited police department.

The accreditation recognition ensures that a police organization is in compliance with the most contemporary management and operational practices. In order to attain this recognition, the organization must comply with more than 200 accreditation standards on topics such as Police Communications, Investigations, Police Procedures, Community Relations, Safety, Arrest Procedures, Professional Ethics, and Emergency Preparedness. An assessment is conducted by CFA in three-year intervals to ensure that member agencies remain in compliance with these rigid professional standards.

Achieving accredited status truly exemplifies the commitment of our dedicated police officers and staff to our mission of providing professional law enforcement services to the university community.

When we developed the [Vision 20/20 Strategic Plan](#) in 2014, we set our course with six Bold Goals:

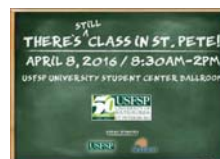


- Distinctive Identity

Faculty Accolades, Achievements

Drs. Julie Buckner Armstrong and **Thomas Hallock** shared their latest creative-scholarly projects in an unlikely setting--Old Key West Bar and Grill--as part of Wordier Than Thou's literary pub crawl on Feb. 27.

Dr. Tiffany Chenneville, associate professor of Psychology, presented two posters at the USF HIV Research and Practice Symposium on March 3. The first, which was co-authored with students, described findings from an exploratory research project focused on the psychosocial needs of youth with HIV in Kenya. The second described facilitators and barriers to implementing integrated health care in a pediatric HIV specialty clinic.

Family Study Center faculty and staff (Dr. Jamie McHale, Lisa Negrini, Dr. Allison Pinto, and Ebony Miller) partnered with more than two dozen community organizations to deliver community workshops and training for more than 300 parents and professionals during "Baby Talk Week."

Dr. Thomas Hallock, associate professor of English, had a short profile "Eboe's Landing" featured in the most recent Society of Early Americanists Newsletter.

Dr. Jennifer O'Brien, assistant professor of Psychology, has been invited to present her research entitled "Can value learning modulate early visual processing?" at the 2016 Vision Sciences Society Annual Meeting in St. Pete Beach. She also received a USFSP Internal Grant to study "Top-down effects of learned value on early visual processing."

Dr. Wendy Rote, assistant professor of Psychology, was awarded a USFSP internal research grant to study parent-adolescent communication surrounding issues that produce feelings of guilt in children.

Dr. Mark Walters, professor of Journalism and Media Studies, author and veterinarian, recently signed a contract with University Press of Florida for a book on the vanishing Florida Scrub Jay, the state's only endemic bird. This will be Walters' sixth book.
