Discussions and Announcements:

Deb spoke of the upcoming Faculty Council meeting at which an ad hoc campus-wide committee will be formed to work on guidelines for tenure and promotion, annual reviews and, especially, a code of ethics. Because she feels the Library should have a presence, she asked for a volunteer. Patricia has agreed to serve on the committee. Deb also needs someone to sit in on this Friday's meeting.

Kathy announced that the Library will have Trick or Treat-ers on Friday; there will be approximately 40 children coming over from the Family Village. Kathy asked for suggestions for non-candy handouts.

At least three Library staff will be working at the Festival of Reading this weekend—Jim, Robert V. and Tom Hagood. Parking will be at a premium, but the campus police will be present to assist. Attendance is estimated to be around 15,000. From 2:00-4:00 in POY217, the Library will be hosting book "evaluations."

Under the new Sexual Harassment Policy, all are charged with reporting to the Office of Diversity and Equal Opportunity anything observed or brought to their attention.
