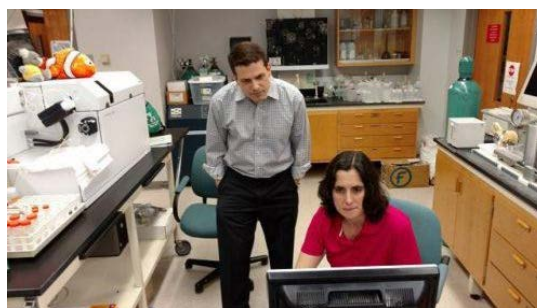

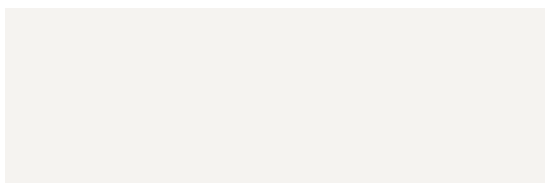
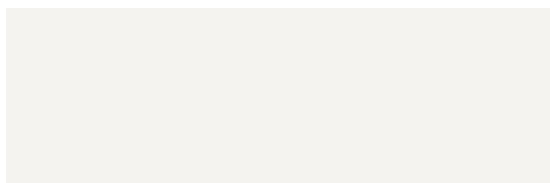
Journalism Students Investigate LEAD IN LOCAL DRINKING WATER
