Speaking of the Community Chest the Sentinel urges you to make your pledge early and big this year.

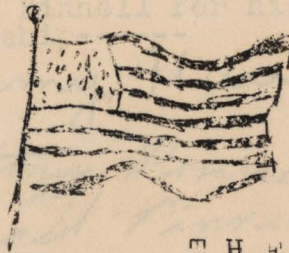
We are sorry to learn that Billy Duncan, while playing baseball Wednesday, broke his ankle. We sure hope it gets well quick, Billy.
