The book has been professionally edited, including a number of maps and photographs, and was published by Chicago Review Press this year.

Hi everyone,

I've recently added a database to the NCGenWeb site of indexed students (mostly seniors) from the hundreds of yearbooks that the North Carolina Digital Heritage Center has been making available online over the last six months. The index currently includes more than 16,000 names from over 200 yearbooks and has a focus on those from 1930 and earlier (with some exceptions).

If you have research interests in NC you may be interested as the database allows you to search by name, city, county, state, year and school. You can find it online at <http://www.ncgenweb-data.com/ybook>. There are some things still to tweak so please let me know if you find anything odd, but overall, it should be a great starting point given the difficulty of locating groups of people from a specific geographic region in the digitized yearbooks.

Question 1: I am interested in getting some more knowledge about public libraries (especially) publishing some of their owned, public domain materials, and selling them for a profit. We are considering doing so, using the various digitizing machines that we have to render titles into a digital format, but also I am interested in knowing if any other libraries out there are doing so, and especially if they are doing so by selling actual printed materials. Initial research seems to show just online databases like ContentDM, PLEADE, etc., and I am looking for actual places that have done so, or at least where to find more info (like a mailing list?).

She wants me to find out how much of a cost it would be to get into that, such as arranging for binding etc., or should we contract that out. It sounds nice, but there's no point in doing it if we just break even.

Question 2: is anyone out there charging for access to their online data? My director feels that we should allow free access to our indexes to card holders of our county, but perhaps charge a fee for looking at those indexes to those outside this county in addition to charging for copies of the indexed material. Anyone doing that?

I am cleaning out some genealogical materials (books, loose papers, genealogies, etc.) and I don't want to throw anything away that might help someone with their family research.

We put indexes and finding aids online with the intent that researchers will come
to the physical library and/or write to us for copies and/or research for a fee.

I am aware of public libraries that make online databases and indexes accessible
only with a library card number and pin, then charge a fee for a library card to
out-of-county residents.

As for reprints, for a decade or more we have had both private individuals and
genealogical/historical societies publishing facsimile reprints of out-of-copyright
county histories, atlases, etc., and selling them in local bookstores, by mail
order through their newsletters, and via the Internet. If you want to increase the
saleability of an old history, compile an everyname index (both people and places)
and include it in the reprint. Many older books have poor indexes or none at all.

I can't recommend a publisher or publishing method, but advise you to do lots of
comparison shopping and request to see actual samples of the published books. I
have seen wildly varying prices and some pretty shoddy binding at even the highest
price ranges. Get prices for the printing of unbound manuscripts, then check with
binderies such as HF Group (formerly Heckman Bindery) and others who are reasonably
priced and deal with libraries all the time. You may not have as flashy a cover,
but you will be able to keep your book at an affordable price for your public.

We were looking for a lower cost digital option, so we bought an Eyecom DRS-5000. It is a little slow and clunky to use, but it was significantly cheaper than other options we looked at. We got a phone call from NewspaperArchive.com this week advising us that they were under new management and would be dropping remote access to their product via genealogical societies/libraries, and it was cut off almost immediately. Have others had a similar experience with this product? Is there an alternate remote use vendor for newspaper images (other than free Library of Congress)? I guess the company was losing too many individual subscribers in the bad economy. It's too bad they cannot offer just remote use of the Ohio newspapers (in our case) to users, and that would be the advertisement to get subscribers to their full product. That would be beneficial to both groups. Heritage Quest (ProQuest owned) did the same thing a couple years ago and pulled the plug on remote use to genealogical society libraries. We have been seeing increased membership in our group but we don't know how much of it was due to the NewspaperArchive product. We also have just opened a new library, have really pushed membership, and the TV show has been good for business across the board. Hopefully this won't hurt us like the loss of Heritage

Quest did.

It had automatic document feed, text conversion software and a negative adapter. The other selling point was the fact that it had a legal size bed, something that couldn't be purchased at retail stores. I purchased it mail order directly from HP. It was expensive, about \$800, but well worth it.

Ditto on the ScanPro. Overall we've had a really great experience with our ScanPro 1000. Because it takes up so little space, we're able to keep it with our other computers so it can still be used by patrons even when it's not being used for microfilm. It is kind of loud when you use the auto advance motorized controls, though. I myself always advance the film manually because I think it's quieter and is easier to scan with the naked eye. The auto color/brightness etc generally does an excellent job with the printed page.

I read in the November 2009 issue of American Libraries (p 60) that the ScanPro 2000 will have Word-Search technology software that allows users to search the microfilm for keywords using some kind of OCR. I really wish this was backwards compatible with ScanPro 1000 because that sounds freakin awesome! :)

Maybe an analogy with the Internet when it was new.

IF you were one of the few brave readers of printed books in 2007 who crossed the divide into digital reading, your options were sparse and expensive. The original Amazon Kindle, for example, cost \$400, and its screen displayed a mere four shades of gray.

Today, digital readers are much cheaper and come with significantly better displays and storage space. But things are just getting started - like the price war that erupted last week between Amazon and Barnes & Noble that pushed the prices of their

e-books below \$200. Those e-readers are also facing challenges from other gadgets that can display books, newspapers and magazines, including mobile phones and the new tablet computers like the iPad. Apple said last week that it had sold 3 million iPads in 80 days.

? For the next few months, not every item in the Virginia Room will be available. At this time access to journals and periodicals is limited to Virginia history titles covered by the Virginia Historical Index by Earl Gregg Swem.  
? The Virginia Room will be CLOSED from Monday, July 26, through Monday, Aug. 9. The Virginia Room will reopen with full services on Tuesday, Aug. 10.

Throughout the summer, Virginia Room researchers will see changes in the research library. Demolition, paint, carpeting and tile will transform the space. New library tables with power outlets and light fixtures will create a reading area worthy of the depth and breadth of the Virginia Room collection. The renovation/expansion project is on track. The major work has been tightly scheduled to create as little inconvenience as possible.

Our Library purchased both a Kindle and, more recently, a Nook so we could see if they were appropriate for patron use. With the Nook, we had to attach a credit card number to our registration and that enabled the user to do a 1-stop ordering at will, charging all materials to that credit card. This raised a large flag with us since we didn't want patrons to be able to charge additional books on our Library's credit account. We were hoping to be able to use it with our OverDrive digital collection, but it also requires the user to download Adobe software onto their computer and then transfer ebooks to the Nook using that software. The hitch is that the Nook must also have Adobe software registered under the same person's name as the one on the computer. Since the Library's name is on the Nook, that wouldn't work well unless the library was also the one to download the ebook from OverDrive. You can see how complicated this gets - and how time consuming it would be for Librarians.

We still love the digital devices, but we're using them to help troubleshoot problems posed to us by patrons who have their own devices and want to use our OverDrive products on the Nook. I'm waiting until the licensing issues are worked out and the formats become standard!!
