Adult Survival Class Set for Grant Park

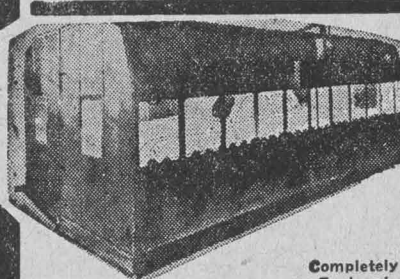
