JAMBALAYA (4 to 6 Servings)

| 1/2 cup chopped green onion | 2 dozen raw oysters (about 1 cup, or 1 cup cubed, cooked ham may be used instead of oysters) |
| 1/2 cup chopped white onion | |
| 1 large green pepper, cut in strips | 1 lb. can tomatoes |
| 1/2 cup chopped celery with a few leaves | 1 cup chicken broth |
| 1 teaspoon minced garlic | 1/2 teaspoon salt |
| 1/3 cup butter | 1/4 teaspoon cayenne |
| 1/2 to 1 lb. raw shrimp, peeled and cleaned | 1 cup raw rice |

In a large pan saute onion, green pepper, celery and garlic in the butter until tender but not browned. Add shrimp and oysters and cook 5 minutes. (If ham is used instead of oysters add the ham when rice is added.) Add the tomatoes, chicken broth, salt, cayenne and rice, stir and cover. Cook 25 to 30 minutes over low heat or until rice is done. If mixture becomes too dry, add tomato juice. Taste for seasoning.

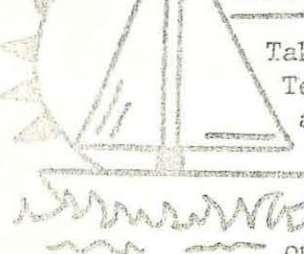
