We do not allow patrons to bring in anything but a tablet, a few loose papers, pencil, computer (without case or bag). When there is less on the table it is easier to see what happens with a single item than if there are multiple personal items and a stack of clippings or brochures. They can still slip something inside the tablet, shirt, pocket, etc., but the possibilities are reduced.

This has worked very well for us. And there are many additional benefits beyond keeping unique materials from disappearing (wider audience, access for your customers when the library is not open, etc.).

Ironically, this happened to us two weeks ago. Our policy changed immediately. We are now locking the door where the files are located and only staff/volunteers can pull the files for our patrons. Too much work goes into the files.

We also have a sign in sheet that asks for their name, address, phone/email and what file they want to look at. Fortunately, all of our files are in the catalog so they can search first before we pull them. I must say cataloging them was the best decision I made.

Future plan is to scan every file so it can be used as a control and backup. We have already started on some of the most requested files.

Of late, they have started a registration/signout scheme which seems to work well. And Curt Witcher makes a good point. Use of the actual original oldest city directories has dropped to zero since those were digitized and made available for free on the library's web site.

There will always be those few who spoil things for the many. Digitizing makes items available while keeping the originals secure.

Our vertical files and other Nebraska Reference materials are all in a room accessible only to staff. We have patrons sit at a table we have set up behind the reference desk to use the files (or anything particularly delicate or rare). Apart from the risk of theft, we used to find clippings on the floor where people had accidentally dropped them. I think having a special protocol also reinforces the idea that these materials are something to be careful with.

I'm pretty sure it is stateless (or staatenlos) given the date and the place of birth. Did the grandfather come from Lithuania directly or from an intermediary country such as Germany? STL was commonly used by the International Refugee organizations and UNRRA for displaced persons. If you send me the grandfather's name, dob and pob, I can do a quick search of the index of the International Tracing Service records held at the US Holocaust Memorial Museum. which is full of DP records. You can email me directly at mlewis at ushmm.org. If I find the grandfather in the index, the patron can submit a request for a full search of the collection.

If the grandfather was a DP in Germany, there are two ways he ended up there: 1) He had been taken for labor in Germany by the Nazis and refused/avoided repatriation 2) He fled Lithuania when it became clear the Soviets were permanently occupying it.

They rely on keyword searching, not subject searching, and claim to be able to effectively search databases with varying structures and architectures. They all send back too many results, many that are also not relevant. These search are not (or at least not yet) the solution that vendors thought that they would be and librarians hoped they would be. Everyone hoped that they would allow effective simultaneous searching or all or most of a library?s electronic resources. They do allow simultaneous searching, but many librarians would argue that the ?effective? part of this goal hasn?t been achieved. They are frustrating for novice and experienced searchers. Libraries spend thousands of dollars on them (they are not cheap) and hours setting them up and tweaking them, and searchers still get too many items in the results list that are only tangentially related to your search topic or not related at all.

We have some patrons who just can't grasp computer searching at all. They could be taught to use HeritageQuest successfully on their own, although they still needed help when they had to switch to Ancestry for resources not found in HQ. This change will mean we will have more people requesting help, although not more staff time available to help them.

I also will miss the types of research mentioned by others that allowed you to winnow out very specific results, such as those that allowed the identification of orphan train children. Pam,

More than a decade ago the public library where I worked had a digital project to acquire local photographs because no central collection existed.

One local newspaper gave us a big box of prints (unfixed -- newspapers can't be bothered) from the previous 20-30 years with no stipulations. I asked but they weren't worried about copyright. Local ownership had its advantages. They were happy to be rid of them and to contribute to a community project. We scanned the pix and occasionally we come across the story that goes with one or another. Better than not having the pix. (The library does have microfilm of the newspapers but of course not all photos get used.) The newspaper since has changed ownership.

That said, I would have liked a deed of gift ... but few of even individuals we dealt with in the project knew who made a particular photo (or when) and had no idea whether they had authority to assign copyright or use. Again, for us the risk was worth it to preserve unique parts of local history and the collection is better than not having the photos at all. Thousands of people have enjoyed many of the photos on a Facebook group set up by an individual for local memories (and history from before our time).

My two cents.

I just tried using Heritage Quest, and I do not like the search that is on it now. The old method was so much better. I use both Ancestry and HQ when I have difficulty in locating someone. In the old HQ you could search for a surname and it would give you everyone by that surname living in each county of the state. I have found many people this way. Due to the problems with legibility of census takers writing and with transcription errors, this method was very helpful. The only thing I see that I can do now, is browse each line of the census.

I'm contort with Mark Mullinax's remark on how bad the indexing has been for Ancestry.com, and Heritage Quest too. I found it easier to go to Heritage Quest if I wish to go to the ?Browse? mode. However, unlike, Ancestry.com search method on their own website tends to focus on whatever names at the latest or newest database info, such as the 1940 census or then backwards, while Heritage Quest I can just focus on what census year I desire and to see if I can find who I am looking for.

Heritage Quest kept the search steps simple, not complex like Ancestry.com. Ancestry.com search engine really is a hinder to our research process. Although, on Heritage Quest, I still can click on any given census year but the assortment of names is incredibly crazy like on the Ancestry.com site.

Also, having worked in a county clerk's and a law office before becoming a

librarian - there are plenty of genealogically useful items that you HAVE to see in person. They are not online at all.
