We started doing this back in the mid 1980s. It was done in Word, and typed in.

After many trials and tribulations, it is now entered into Excel, and the IT dept. (after we paid an exorbitant amount to a local firm who created the original search screen, before my time) converts it into a searchable database on the library's web site (That happened after I retired.)

At this time staff people go through the births, marriages, and deaths as they are printed in the paper, type them into Excel, and once a month the IT dept loads them online. The info is in Excel format, so they could be stored that way. Again, I do not know what current practice is. I wanted to do like the Hayes library/Becky Hill does. That was not to be. We also had nibbles from Ancestry. No go.

We used to send them out for free; gradually moved to a quarter, a dollar, five dollars, and now each copy is sent (usually electronically) for 15 dollars. When I was there, we would send out perhaps 200 a month. I do not know what the current number is.

Our library Local History staff (and at one point volunteers) has been entering the obituaries/death notices into an indexing software called Cindex for about 20 years. We are now transitioning the data to an online database to be part of our new library website which is to launch in September. We're still in the early days of the transition so still entering the information in the indexing software for the moment. Our system just hired someone with database development experience so we're the top of his project list. We also maintain a news index for the local stories in the paper (unfortunately not the births, marriages, or letters to the editor). Transitioning that index will happen after the obits/death index is transferred over.

My previous library entered all of their obituaries into the library's catalog programs as a modified MARC record. It had its benefits and drawbacks to say the least.

Both libraries maintain a collection of the local newspapers on microfilm but index current information from the physical paper. Unfortunately in some time periods, the edition microfilmed was not the edition indexed...

Occasionally an obituary would be clipped and saved for the clippings files but not standard practice.

We then began a project where the older obituaries were scanned and uploaded to our online catalog, currently Polaris. With current obituaries, we scan and upload them then keep the physical copy in our card catalog.

Pretty soon we are going to run out of room in the current cabinet. I'm hoping we can get a second cabinet so we can continue to keep the physical obituaries as well as the electronic file.

Do you know what month or season? Yellow Fever was common and outbreaks were frequent in coastal or swampy areas: <http://www.pbs.org/wgbh/amex/fever/map/> . The Philadelphia Epidemic of 1793 is probably the best known, but the disease was a serious problem for many years before and after.

This database gives the names and addresses for the sender in Israel and the recipient in Poland.

In the late 1980s, the Dyer Memorial Library started collecting obits for people who had some sort of connection to the towns of Abington, Rockland, and Whitman, Mass. (Old Abington). We now have a nice collection of 27 3" binders that is up-to-date. During the 1980s, someone also collected several hundred obituaries spanning the years 1883-1985. All of those are all contained in one binder.

It would be wonderful to scan images of the obits or create a searchable database but we just don't have the people-power or funds to do that. So, we're using an old fashioned but proven method: entering information into a spreadsheet for the specific year and saving it as a PDF. The spreadsheet can be updated if necessary. The PDF can be searched by name.?

Obituaries are collected from the Abington Mariner, the Rockland Standard and the Brockton Enterprise newspapers and also online if it doesn't appear in print. The Boston Globe is also scanned because, occasionally, someone shows up there especially if the person was a prominent individual.

The index includes the following:

Obituary Datethe Newspaper the obituary appeared in (it could be all three), and?

Town the deceased was associated with - AB/RK/WH

I started the obituary indexing project 6 months ago because I found myself with 3 volunteers who had the perfect skillsets to help. One subscribes to most of the newspapers, gives the obituary sections to us and does a little data entry. Another is a professional genealogist who examines every obituary to make certain the b/m/d and names are accurate, supplements information where necessary, and does data entry. (She took the analysis of the obituary component on herself. She was only asked to help with the data entry.) The 3rd volunteer has mad data entry skills.?

The obits are clipped and photocopied from the newspaper and the original is thrown away. They are then added to binders in alphabetical order by year.?

At this time, storage space for the binders is not an issue.?

I do not expect a surge in requests once the indexes are online but we will likely be charging a \$5.00 fee to cover the cost of paper and binders. Thanks to Square, we will be able to easily accept online payments.

Our part-time librarian staff index all articles from the local paper that pertain to our town or its inhabitants (including obituaries). I created an MS Access database with a drop-down menu for the topics, a box to put in the headline or deceased person's name, a box for the page number and another box for the issue date which defaults to the current date. We have the entire run of the paper on microfilm.

We had been doing this on index cards and then having someone type it all up at the end of the year, but now I can just generate a report in Access. It can also be put into Word which makes it easy to edit. In January, I print it out and put it into binders.

FINDING NEWS AND OBITUARIES OF PRINCE WILLIAM PEOPLE

In 1993, RELIC volunteers began perusing The (Manassas) Journal Messenger and The Potomac News, abstracting news articles and obituaries into what has become a massive index to our local papers. The system isn't perfect, and plenty of gaps exist for periods when volunteers were unable to keep up with the daily grind. Furthermore, our newspaper landscape has changed since then. Different titles exist now, with different ideas of news coverage. Still our volunteers continue to devote many hours each month, contributing to this database. Recent obituaries are more likely to be found online on news or funeral home sites, and may include full text instead of just an index. As time has permitted, staff have also gone back before 1993 to include earlier obituaries and selected news items. Our online obituary index now is fairly comprehensive back to 1971.

Our Local Newspaper

Index<<http://www.pwcgov.org/government/dept/library/Pages/Local-Newspaper-Index-Search.aspx>> is keyword searchable. Individual words will bring up entries that have the words anywhere. Putting quotes ("-") around a group of words will find that phrase. RELIC has microfilm or paper files of all titles included in this index.

Prince William newspapers prior to 1939 (and a few after that date) can be found as part of our Digital Library<<http://eservice.pwcgov.org/library/digitalLibrary/>>, under Newspaper Archives. Although we do not have an engine that can search all of them at once, individual issues may be searched electronically: Open an issue.

Click on CTRL+A to see if it is OCR readable (text will turn blue). Then CTRL+F to use the "Find" function. Each word it finds will be highlighted.

Under Vital Records - Deaths in the Digital Library, you can see indexes to obituaries in The Manassas Democrat, 1909-1921, The Manassas Journal, 1911-1915, and burials from Baker Funeral Home, 1931-1980.

Another useful source for Prince William news and obituaries is the ProQuest Historical Newspapers: The Washington Post, 1877-1999, which included Prince William items even in its early days. This database is accessible to Prince William library card holders through our library's webpage www.pwcgov.org/library under "Premium Sites."

Other library systems may also offer this news source as a service to their customers.

Between 1976 & 1989 the Northeast Iowa Genealogical Society clipped obituaries that had a connection to Black Hawk County, Iowa, from the Waterloo Courier and pasted them in scrapbooks that were housed at the Grout Museum in Waterloo. About 1990 the Society began clipping the obituaries, pasted them on 3x5? and later 4 x 6 ? cards, alphabetized them, and placed them in file drawers at the Grout Museum. This continued until about 2000 when it became too difficult to find volunteers to clip and file the obits. We had also been clipping all obituaries from the Courier and space for keeping the cards was becoming a problem.

I was already indexing the Waterloo Courier for Obituary Daily Times, and suggested that members volunteer to index obituaries for a month using a ? "traveling" small laptop donated by a member that had the indexing program installed. I would continue as the contact for ODT, and forward the indexes to the Coordinator. About this time we also started indexing the obituary notices since newspapers started charging for printing obituaries, and some people opted to only have notices since they were still free.

I downloaded the file from the ?traveling? computer at the next genealogy meeting and the next person took it home to do the indexing. This worked well until

about 2014 when the Macintosh operating system would no longer access the ObitFiler program we were using. So after a time, one of the OBT contributors adapted EXCEL to obituary indexing and we began using this on our ?traveling? computer, if the indexer does not have a computer or the EXCEL program. They can save and attach the file to an email message to me and then I forward it on to the ODT coordinator.

One of the requirements of ODT is that indexers are to provide copies of the obituary if requested by other indexers of ODT. Since many of the newspapers are now online, I am infrequently asked for obituaries anymore. as people can go online and find them at the newspaper or the funeral homes.

I looked at several pages preceding and following the page in question, and none of them had similar markings. In the image, it looked to me like the enumerator had written the circles, with the check marks made by another pen. I wonder whether the enumerator questioned that the family may have been something "other" than white, black, or mulatto - the only options provided on the form - and indicated this with a lower-case O. The check marks could indicate that the enumerator or someone else had checked to make sure the persons in question qualified as "white." (I grew up in the Jim Crow South, & I could tell you stories that would make your ears steam.)

I did not find an answer to our specific question, but I learned a lot from two article by Elizabeth Shown Mills that I stumbled upon in my search:
