Aleppo Britot ? Rabbi Dayan 1868-1945: (7,555) (no images) IGRA thanks Sarina Roffe for sharing this special database with us. Books were kept in Aleppo with information regarding the Brit Mila for the male infants in the years listed above. These records were kept by the Mohel ? and during this period there were several. Additional information regarding this database can be found through this link on the SephardicGen website. The Hebrew date and general date are given. The database is in Hebrew.

Jewish Students in Palestine, 1916: (73) (no images) This file was found at the Central Zionist Archives. Those mentioned were Jewish Students being followed by the Turks. There are some comments in addition to the name of the student.

Americans in Palestine, 1929: (125) (images available) We thank Rabbi Gary Gans for sharing this file with us and allowing us to prepare the database and make it available to you. The information could be a letter or a list with possibly names of additional family members, an address and locality.

Voters for Municipal Council Petah Tikva, 1939: (6,952) (images available) This list is typed, in Hebrew and was located in the Israel State Archives. The information you can see, in most cases, is the name, age, street and if they have the qualifications to be elected as a member of the Council. This includes both males and females. You may find more than one family member at the address..

Operation ?On Eagles Wings? ? October, 1949: (4,983) (no images) We are adding close to 5,000 names to our collection of those who came to Israel from Yemen in 1949 in Operation ?On Eagles Wings?. This project is done in conjunction with the JDC and each record has a link which will take you to the record on the JDC website.

1963 Telephone Directory Tel Aviv area ? Letters I-J: (1287) (images available) Phone books can provide some interesting information about our families. In this phone book (in English) you may find an occupation in addition to the street address, phone number and locality. For our members looking at the page from the phone book, you might also be able to connect with additional family members.

Some reminders ? when there are images connected with our databases, these images are only visible to paid members of IGRA. Our membership year is from January 1 to December 31 each year. If you have not yet renewed, following a short grace period, access will be denied to those images and additional member benefits. Those joining IGRA during December will enjoy membership through the end of 2018.

It is only possible to continue to bring additional databases with the help of volunteers. Many projects can be worked on one page at a time (about 40 lines). Is there anyone in Texas that would like census microfilm (except Texas, which we are keeping)? If you are within driving distance from Weatherford, you can save postage and come pick it up. We are talking about 880 rolls of microfilm. I will also be withdrawing quite a few census roll from various Native American tribes, some deed rolls from various counties, immigration rolls, service records for the Mexican War from Texas volunteers, etc. It is too long a list for me to post, (probably another 400-600 rolls) but if you contact me with a specific title or collection, I can tell you if the film is in our collection and will be withdrawn. Due to lack of space and no plans in the foreseeable future to expand, I have been directed to withdraw probably 80% of our collection of books and microfilm. Currently I have a library about 2 hours away from me taking some books and another genealogy society taking some but neither have space for the amount of microfilm we need to withdraw.

RELIC INSIDER:

USING RELIC'S FAMILY FILES

Since the 1970s, RELIC has been collecting information on Northern Virginia families, particularly those with a presence in Prince William County. RELIC's Family Files now have grown to six lateral file drawers. Their file folders, arranged alphabetically by surname, contain a wide variety of papers. Most of them include correspondence we have responded to over the years. They may also contain news clippings, pedigree charts, family histories, Bible records, obituaries, biographical sketches, court house documents, and family letters - anything "ephemeral" that doesn't lend itself to being formally cataloged.

The Genealogical Exchange File (GEF) is the key to quickly determining whether we have a file on a certain surname. This card index identifies people who are looking for particular ancestors from Prince William. If there is a blue index card in the GEF, it means we have a file folder on that family. A form on our website at http://www.pwcgov.org/government/dept/library/pages/relic-genealogical-exchange-form.aspx allows you to submit information on your family for the GEF. To determine which other researchers are interested in your family, please contact the RELIC staff.

Most of our cataloged family histories can be found on the shelf at RELIC 929.2, arranged alphabetically by surname. You can find them listed in our Library's general catalog, http://librarycatalog.pwcgov.org , which may be searched by keyword, author, title, or family surname (subject). Some of the catalog entries have been enhanced with surnames besides the primary family, including the identity of the earliest ancestor.

I don?t judge research interests or how important a person?s family was. Sometimes the ?least important? documented people tell us more than the most documented. Also, related to genealogy research is the field of public history and social history. I recently presented at the North Carolina Library Association conference on bringing new users to Special Collections through promotion of genealogy. Perhaps the blogger would like a copy of my presentation?

Again, who are we to say there is no value in personal family research? The blogger obviously doesn?t know anything about the citizen science movement around genetic genealogy. Without genealogists doing family history research, there would be no movement and none of the scientific data that has been collected by them.

The issue about the ILL polices of the Lincoln library is a change and people are often upset by change. I?m not sure that is a reason to belittle them. When people become upset, whether they be genealogists or others, that we don?t ILL, I explain the importance of preserving our books for all. I offer alternative such as copying indexes and doing look ups. I don?t look at them with condescension or congratulate myself on knowing more about library processes than a patron.

I was at the ALPL for a meeting in late November when we were told ILL had stopped, not will be stopping, but HAD stopped. We were not informed ahead of time, which would have been a nice courtesy. While I am frustrated and personally disappointed by how the policy was changed without advanced notice (most libraries alert other ILL departments when a major change is coming, so we can alert our patrons and colleagues) I understand the change. In defense of the blogger's 'angry genealogists' for those patrons who have benefited from the ILL policy in the past, it is a painful adjustment. Many people do not have the luxury to travel to Springfield to access much needed documentation or newspaper verification for a research project, whether genealogical in nature or not. The article does paint genealogists in a rude and unmannerly way. Is it unfair? I say yes.

We are not to judge why and how a patron needs access to materials, our job is to provide the best service we can with all available resources.

As an aside, we were informed by the librarian at the ALPL that newspapers will be digitized over the next several years so there will be times when portions of that collection will be unavailable. I hope they will have the forethought to let their colleagues know so we can all plan accordingly. Unfortunately for those 'angry genealogists' who may be seeking Lincoln books, Civil War atlases or other previously circulating items, they'll have to visit Springfield for access.

Personally, I emailed the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum and Library, since it was their policy change that seemed to kick all this off. I mostly emailed them so they'd be aware the post is out there, but also as I invented them to comment on the Annoyed Librarian's blog post and make it clear that (hopefully!) the blogger's views are not representative of their

own. (Again, this is likely not a priority for ALPML, but it seemed like if they would distance themselves from the content, it could go a long way to cooling the situation down.)

And, more broadly...

Does anyone have suggestions for advocating for our user group within the broader library culture? There certainly are stereotypes of genealogists (as evidenced in the Annoyed Librarian's post) -- how do we combat them?

I'd love to hear some thoughts on this broader issue.

## Here are my thoughts:

- The blogger is correct: librarians do have a right -- an obligation -to make policies consistent with the library's mission.
- When users are upset or angry they often complain in general terms. They are not familiar with how libraries work and, understandably, see things from their own point of view and don't always express themselves professionally. In the library world, users are not the professionals. Librarians are.
- Librarians are professionals and should be able to professionally explain the rationale for a policy. It is always good to express (sincere) regret when a policy doesn't work out for a patron and there is no need to get snarky about personal statements. Not everyone will accept an inconvenient rationale, but we should be able to make people see the reasoning behind it.
- However, "One book got lost" is not a rationale.
- Both librarians shared responsibility for the mishap that caused the policy change.
  - The librarian at the borrowing library should have been able to discover the digital copy available for less than the cost of a loan and refer the patron to that without ever requesting the book on loan.
  - The librarian at the lending library should have discovered the digital copy and sent a helpful response that would have alerted the requestor to the availability of the digital copy.
  - If the lending library has an "In Library Use ONLY" policy they should take efforts to be sure borrowers are reminding of it.

(For what it

is worth, we used wrappers on our books.)

- Assuming the borrowing library was made aware of the policy, that library was very remiss in letting the book circulate out of the library and they should offer to pay for the expensive replacement.

Failing that,

the lending library should contact them to negotiate the cost of replacing

the book had procedures been properly followed.

- In short, this was a failure of procedures, not policy and it is those that should have been reviewed... by both libraries.
