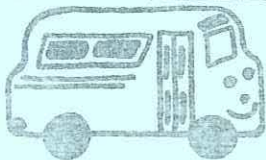

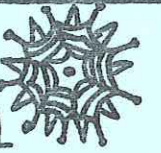

MAMA'S FRUITCOCKTAIL CAKE

Thanks to Ginger Gregory

1½ cups sugar
2 eggs
2 cups flour (self-rising)
1 pinch baking soda
¼ cup cooking oil (or melted butter)
1 can fruitcocktail (medium size)
using syrup

Mix ingredients together. Pour into 9x12" greased (not floured) pan. Sprinkle top with ½ cup nuts and ½ cup brown sugar. Bake at 325° for 35 to 40 min. or until a rich brown.
