PRINCE WILLIAM SCHOOL YEARBOOKS COMING ONLINE

Efforts to digitize Prince William County's high school yearbooks are coming to fruition. You can now see the first group of yearbooks, linked to our website, thanks to the collaboration of the Prince William Public Library's Office of Community Engagement and the Library of Virginia's Department of Library Technology and Networking.

Ten yearbooks from the period 1949 to 1966 for Jennie Dean High School in Manassas have been posted on the Internet Archive. Jennie Dean was founded in 1894 as the Manassas Industrial School for Colored Youth, the first secondary school for African-Americans in Northern Virginia. In 1938, the school was transferred to the control of the counties of Prince William, Fairfax and Fauquier, and renamed the Manassas Regional High School. By 1949 the facility was commonly called Jennie

Dean High School. In 1966, when Prince William schools were finally desegregated, high school students were transferred to previously white schools and Jennie Dean became a middle school.

Yearbooks for Jennie Dean have been borrowed and scanned with the assistance of Ivy Joe Davis, graduate of the class of '63. He hopes that even more alumni will come forward and share their yearbooks. They can be seen at <http://www.pwcgov.org/government/dept/library/pages/relichistoricrepository.aspx> (YEARBOOKS). Or you can search Google for "JENNIE DEAN" + "JAY DEE" (the yearbook title).

We expect that additional pre-1977 Prince William yearbooks will be posted online very soon, followed by more recent school annuals.

Updated Databases

Montefiore Census Records 1839-1875 60,157 Listings

IGRA is very proud of its participation in the process of digitizing and indexing the Montefiore Census records. Mathilde Tagger (z'l), Rose Feldman and Billie Stein spearheaded the efforts which began at the IGS and concluded at IGRA. They were joined by a group of

volunteers who spent countless hours deciphering (a variety of script writing is found in the originals), transcribing, translating, researching (for instance occupations were mentioned that no longer exist or are now called by a different name) and finalizing the documents. The results are available on the website of The Montefiore Endowment searchable in both Hebrew and English.

In addition, the index can be searched on the IGRA All Israel Database search engine as well. This allows you to take advantage of our special soundex giving you spelling variations for each surname without having to input each variation on your own. The detail page (available to paid IGRA members) will give you the item number, locality and notes - and a link taking you directly to that item on the Montefiore Endowment website. Those who are registered on the IGRA website will see the name and the year of the census that this record refers to (1839, 1849, 1855, 1866 or 1875).

Voter List - Knesset Israel, Tel Aviv, (Letters Tet - Lamed) 1936
5,296 Listings

The data available includes the name of the father, the age of the voter, sex of the individual, the community they were affiliated with and where they lived at that time. This database is in Hebrew and is from the Historical Municipal Archives of Tel Aviv-Yaffo. (Images included.)

Palestine Marriage/Divorce Certificates 3,916 Listings

These certificates (not from the Rabbinate) may contain where the couple is from, the names of their parents (and witnesses), their occupation, where they were living, their age and more. These are the closest we can offer to a vital record from this time period. The certificates are mostly in Hebrew and is from the Israel State Archives. (Images included.)

Telephone Directory (The Letter B) 1963 3,566 Listings

This telephone directory is from the central region of the country. It gives the address, city/neighborhood and phone number. This database is in English and originates from the Library of Congress. (Images included.)

New Databases

Voter Registry for the Holon Local Council 1945 3,014 Listings

This list identifies those allowed to participate in the election for the Holon Local Council. There is an identification number specific for this election and the name of the person. This database is in Hebrew and is from the Israel State Archives. (Images included.)

Demobilization of Jewish Polish Soldiers in Eretz Israel 1947
272 Listings

These records are of those who were registered as immigrants having served in the Polish Army and was part of a larger collection of Jewish Soldiers in the Polish Army. The name and rank of each soldier is listed. This database is in English and is from the Israel State Archives. (Images included.)

Please note, the IGRA databases are now searchable to all registrants. The search results page is also available to all registrants. Additional details regarding most databases are available only to paid IGRA members. Certain exceptions exist due to requests of the specific archives.

PDF and PDF/A are stable file formats, but CDs are not stable media. If you can get permission for local storage media - much safer. Will the PDFs be full-text? If they are, they are slightly better than microfilm. If you can put them on a server, you can search inside multiple pdfs with the advanced search feature of Adobe Reader (see <https://www.online-tech-tips.com/computer-tips/how-to-search-for-text-inside-multiple-pdf-files-at-once>).

If the issue is software, then the company can probably provide an upgrade, depending on your computer equipment and operating software. If the problem is the physical unit, then it will depend on whether the company can provide replacement parts.

We have three STViewScan machines. Two were purchased in 2011 and one in 2017. We have maintenance contracts on them, so maintaining and repairing them has not been much of an issue. However, models are frequently discontinued as new ones are introduced. Manufacturers are required to produce replacement parts for five years. Once the supply of replacement parts runs out, the models are effectively obsolete, because they cannot be repaired.

The units we bought in 2011 were discontinued shortly afterwards. We are still using them, but are now having difficulty finding replacement parts when they break. One recently needed a new motor. The repair service was able to cobble together a replacement, but we will probably have to start thinking about replacing them. Likewise, the unit we bought in 2017 was discontinued later that year. That means we can obtain replacement parts through 2022.

This is a new paradigm for microfilm readers. We have Minolta machines that are now 15+ years old. Replacement parts are still available, and they continue to provide good service. The digital readers are more akin to PCs. New models come out frequently as improvements are made in the digital camera, so current models are discontinued just as frequently.
