We have owned the Plustek OpticBook A300 scanner for several years. It meets the scanning criteria you specify, and we have been happy with its performance. It does not incorporate a printer but is certainly compatible with all our computers and printers. This machine is primarily used by staff.

We offer the public several Ricoh machines which scan, print and copy, up to 11 x 17. You can print, but only in black and white. You can scan and download color images to a thumb drive. Black and white copies are 15 cents.

We have a stand-alone HP color printer that the public can use from any computer in the library. Copies are 50 cents. It only prints in letter size format (8.5 x 11).

In summary: We can scan large-format items, in color, but cannot print them out at that size. We would send people to commercial vendors for ledger-size printing in color.

Like the Bull Street Library, we have large "copiers" that patrons can use to scan, print, fax up to 11x17. Unlike them, one of ours actually prints in color. The other only prints in black & white. Both scan in color to USB flash drives.

In my room we have another, small multifunction printer, that is connected to our room's public computers as well as our staff computers. It only prints up to legal size, but can do so in color.

We charge \$0.20/page for b&w prints, \$1/page for color, and scanning is free.

For high-fidelity scanning (greater than 600 dpi, and/or post-scan editing), we have a staff-only EPSON GT20000 scanner. We are in process of

replacing this with the EPSON 12000XL and adding an EPSON Perfection V800 to allow large (and small) format transparency scanning (slides, negatives, etc.)

Ravensworth was the largest colonial land grant in Fairfax County, some 24,112 acres. This is a story of colonial settlement, early government, tobacco plantations, slavery, civil war, economic expansion, the rise and decline of family farms, and suburban development - next door to the nation's capital - involving people, places, and events, both famous and obscure. Notable historic figures connected to Ravensworth include George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and Robert E. Lee. Author John Browne shares this story.

FACES FROM THE PAST

Some years ago, a portrait of two young women was donated to RELIC with a minimal amount of information. They were believed to be two sisters of the Buckley family of Prince William County. There was the suggestion (perhaps from their appearance and dress) that they may have been "of Indian blood."

The clothes and jewelry they are wearing, along with the type of artwork, suggest that the picture was made in the late 1870s. The 1880 U.S. census shows that Albert and Britannia Buckley lived in the Gainesville District with their seven children, including daughters Pocahontas (age 27), Columbia (age 23), and Pacific (age 20). The boys included a son named Powhatan (age 25), leading one to wonder if there might be truth to a connection to Native Americans.

RELIC staff Beth Scott has traced this family back several generations and could find no evidence of aboriginal ancestry. It appears that the parents favored unusual names with a historical flair. The picture along with our research is now on display at RELIC.

You would catalog your photographs in Pastperfect and then, if you purchase the capability, they can create an online interface. I believe you have to pay for them to host your online access. They do list their prices right on their site, if you're curious to cost. (It is not actually shareware.) There are other products like CONTENTdm that are geared for library photographic collections. It is a much more complicated and can be very costly. If you're looking for open source options, Omeka is an option. <https://omeka.org/>

Are you trying to just catalog the photographs or are you trying to digitize them and make them available online? I'd be happy to answer specific questions as I have

worked with a few different products over the years.

I like working with PastPerfect, I've done extensive cataloging with it for museums. I feel like for a personal or family project a lot of its features may not be useful or necessary and it is quite pricey for the average consumer, too.

There are some very similar free alternatives, but they take a bit more leg work to set up and most involve the local installation of a server. Some I've used are:

- MuseumArch (<http://www.musarch.com/>) which is a little clunky and outdated, but fairly straightforward;
- Collective Access (<https://www.collectiveaccess.org/>) possibly the prettiest and most functional but more difficult to set up (read: will probably require professional IT help for the average person);
- Omeka (<https://omeka.org/>) for the purposes of cataloging a personal/genealogical project this one is the easiest to use out the gate. It has a fairly good community of users and it is easier to find people who can help with setup and troubleshooting than the other two.
