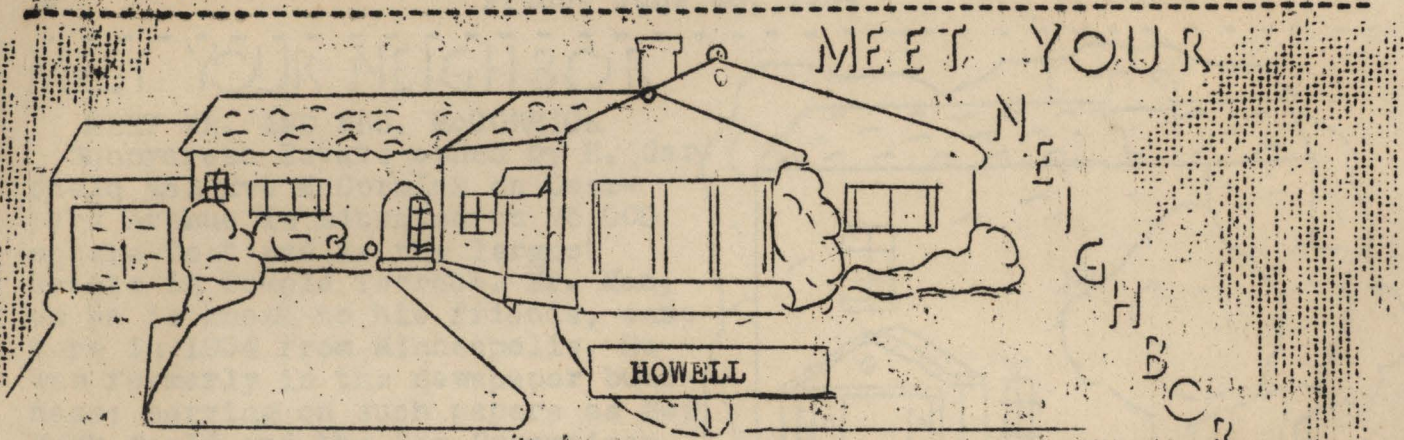

In the way of pets they have a cow, Bessie, three dogs, Ginger, Brownie, and Spot. They also have some chickens and ducks.

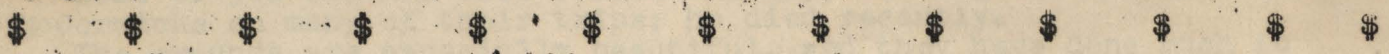
Mrs. Howell has two brothers in the service. Robert Smithwick is in the Navy, and Donewl Smithwick is at the Maritime school in St. Petersburg.
