



## Mackey Awards Staffers Certificates of Appreciation

Five USF employees were presented certificates of appreciation from President Cecil Mackey on Tuesday during an awards breakfast held in the University Center.

Those honored were J.S. "Bill" Andrews, superintendent of landscaping and grounds; Roland E. Carrington, assistant director of personnel; Raymond C. King, director of residence halls; Roxy Neal, acting director of facilities planning; and Frank Spear, director of publications.

Andrews was cited not only for the campus landscaping, but for pursuing the University's equal opportunity program, hiring the first female groundskeepers in the SUS and cooperating with the Hillsborough County Parole Commission's rehabilitation program.

The contributions mentioned which Carrington has made to USF included his service as acting director of personnel services and being a project leader for the joint USF/IBM Information Systems Planning study.

King, referred to as "an exceptional man," was praised for the "positive and quality" living atmosphere he has maintained, as well as for his service to the University on various committees and councils.

A USF employee for over 15 years, Neal was cited for the "steadfastness and common sense" with which he has fulfilled each task, and for the two occasions he has served as acting director of facilities planning.

Spear's contributions included the "quiet professional competence and constant willingness to accept and carry out tasks" which have earned the admiration and thanks of countless friends and colleagues. He was also cited for the role he played in securing favorable postage rates for several USF publications.

## PERC Expected to Certify UFF As Bargaining Agent

With 84 percent of eligible faculty and staff voting in the Mar. 2-3 collective bargaining election, the United Faculty of Florida, affiliate of the American Federation of Teachers (AFL-CIO) received 51.3 percent of the votes cast. If certified by PERC as expected yesterday, the UFF will become the bargaining agent for the 5,431 employees in the Systemwide unit.

Voting totals on the three choices presented on the ballot were: UFF, 2,344 (51.3%); No Agent, 1,304 (28.5%); AAUP, 701 (15.3%). Challenged were 221.

Chancellor E.T. York, Jr. said on the results of the election, "We will accept the judgment of the SUS faculty members and other academic professionals who voted in the election -- and carry out our legal and other responsibilities accordingly. After certification of the results, at the appropriate time and place we will begin the difficult and complex task of trying to negotiate a "collective bar-

## Banquet, Pinning Ceremony Set For Graduating Nursing Students

Graduating College of Nursing students have scheduled a graduation banquet and a pinning ceremony to celebrate the completion of their school days.

The informal graduation banquet will take place tomorrow at 7 p.m. in the University Center. Dinner will be followed by skits and dancing. The banquet will be held for the 40 nurses who will complete training in March and the 20 who will finish in June. The pinning ceremony will honor March graduates only. All will receive their diplomas at USF's June graduation ceremonies at Curtis Hixon Hall. They will be the College of Nursing's second graduating class.

The traditional pinning ceremony has been planned for Mar. 20 at 7 p.m. in Arts and Letters (LET 103). Guest speaker Dr. Joan O'Leary, vice president of nursing at the Bayfront Medical Center, St. Petersburg, will discuss "What Nursing is Today." Linda Wagner, chairman of the College of Nursing Council, will talk on the history of the pinning ceremony and other students will give a history of the USF College of Nursing, which recently moved into its newly completed building.

College of Nursing Dean Gwendoline R. MacDonald will award the pins to the new nurses.

Board of Regents Chairman Marshall Criser added: "We ask for the understanding and patience of the faculties, students and staff of the nine universities - and the people of Florida - as we enter into what in our State is uncharted territory."

## Student and Admin. Service Director Appointed for St. Petersburg Campus

Donald A. Haney has been selected as director of student and administrative service for the St. Petersburg Campus. Haney has been with USF since 1973 as a veterans counselor on the St. Pete Campus and a cooperative education and placement counselor on the Tampa Campus. He will assume the new job Mar. 18. His appointment reflects a recent reorganization and shifting of responsibilities on the St. Petersburg Campus.

Haney, 51, spent 21 years with the U.S. Air Force as an intelligence officer/education and training officer until his retirement as a lieutenant colonel in 1972. He is a veteran of World War II as a U.S. Marine and of Korea and the Vietnam War with the Air Force.

He holds a M.S. in education administration from FSU and a B.A. in social science education from the University of Colorado. He also holds a diploma in Middle East Studies from the American University, Beirut, Lebanon. Before joining USF, he was a veterans service officer for the State's Division of Veterans Affairs.

## 'Mail it Right' Is Among Topics In Mar. 23 Postal Seminar Here

Improving the postal service and reducing mail expenditures will be the focal points of a seminar on the U.S. Postal Service at USF on Mar. 23.

The conference is sponsored by the USF Post Office and the Tampa Bay Area Postal Customers Council, a committee of mail users interested in bettering the mail service. Open and free to the public, the seminar will be from 9 a.m.--noon in the Arts and Letters Auditorium (LET 103).

The program will be designed to instruct and teach mail users about cost reduction and the proper way to use the mail service, said Jack Boyd, USF campus postmaster.

Among topics to be covered are international, bulk rate and express mail along with customer services and a special session for secretaries entitled "Mail it Right."
