STUDENT ASSOCIATION MEETING
OFFICERS' MEETING

January 10, 1972

The meeting was called to order by President Kubler at 3:00 p.m. Those officers present: President Lou Kubler, Vice-President Tom Ford, Treasurer Ron Egger, and Secretary Judy Wilhite. Janice Taylor, Editor was absent. Also present were Mr. Hoffman and Prof. Bridges.

DISCUSSION:

Policy on Sailboat Usage - Mr. Hoffman suggested that a letter be drafted and sent to the President of Windjammers, President Mackey, and President Jeff Smith concerning the mis-use of the sailboat by a member of the Windjammers. This matter has been taken care of. President Kubler suggested that the 'policy of sailboat usage' be printed in this week's "Crows Nest". The policy will first be reviewed by Art Cosgrove.

Medical Kits - The officers felt that it is necessary that we have proper First Aid Kits for all buildings.

Medical Policy - A medical policy must be drafted; a tentative policy has been made and was discussed. Organized Athletics Medical Policy - Provisions could be added to cover both on and off-campus medical costs. It is possible that we may insure all activities through a 'rider' on the Tampa policy.

Voluntary Tutorial Service - Prof. Bridges talked to the officers about a voluntary tutorial service that is to begin on this campus. The officers agreed to handle publicity to get help from interested students through "Crow's Nest", Mr. Thoreson - Counseling, and Publicity Chairman Cindy Carlberg. Insurance coverage was discussed - possibly a 'rider' could be used to cover these students while they are working in schools or hospitals or any other area.

Budget - Allocations to the St. Petersburg Campus have been cut by \$12,000. Ron Egger stated that all clubs and activities have been informed and are to submit their budgets with reasons for money spent. These budgets are to be submitted this week.

BROAD GOALS of the Student Association Officers - (1) Appoint a judiciary, (2) Constitution ratification, (3) Handbook publication - Janice Taylor, (4) Budget set up, and (5) Drawing recognition to this campus at St. Pete.

POLICY ON SAILBOATS USAGE

Effective Immediately

1. Weekend sailing is primarily for recreation and instruction.
2. Boats cannot be reserved by any person or group for more than a two hour block of time.
3. Violations of the time limitation will result in the suspension of sailing privileges for a time to be determined by the student judiciary council, USF, St. Petersburg Campus. Appeals can be made to this council.
4. Individuals and groups are encouraged to call prior to the weekend to make reservations.

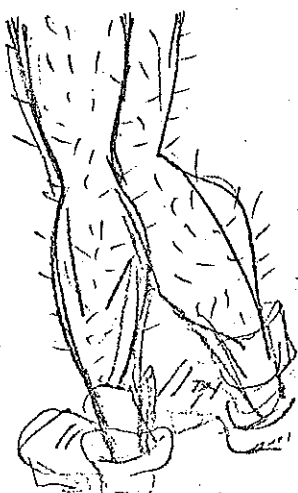
