The purpose of this luncheon is to assemble the ladies of the community and to make plans for helping to beautify Temple Terrace.

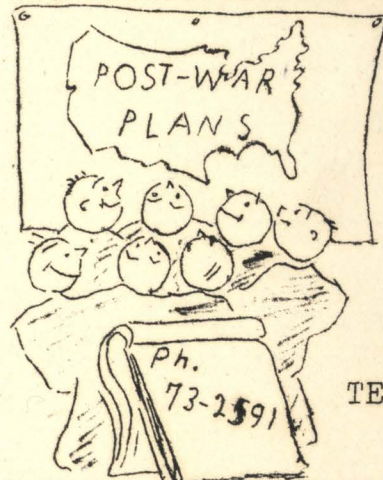
ROBERT E. KNOPKES BUY SEITZ HOME

SIX IN RACE FOR COMMISSION AS QUALIFICATION DEADLINE PASSES

E.A. McCartney is the sixth and last Temple Terrace citizen to qualify as a candidate for election to the Commission of the City of Temple Terrace, subject to the biennial election to be held at the golf club Tuesday, June 4, 1946.

The deadline for qualification as a candidate was noon yesterday, May 21.

Those qualifying as candidates are: Julian Dowling, R. Harry Roller, S. Lester Smith (the incumbent commissioner); and E.A. McCartney, J.K. Powel, and John H. Simmon.

Voters of Temple Terrace must register with the City Clerk, Mrs. J.W. Van De Venter, no later than May 31, if they wish to vote in this election.

According to the City Clerk, forty-four persons have registered to vote.
