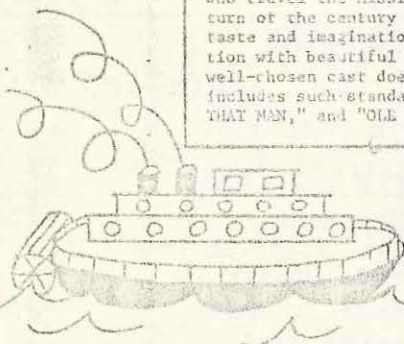

## DAY CARE CENTER TO END THIS QUARTER

- DAN BEEMAN -

Day Care is a legitimate service to be provided for USFSP students. However, the past year's experiment on-campus has indicated problems with the current Center, resulting in the discontinuation of a USFSP Day Care Center. Although our Center staff are excellent, both in terms of working philosophy and quality, other problems led to this decision. Primary among these was the facility itself. The building is simply a firetrap. Secondly, the location next to the pools is very dangerous no matter how well the children were supervised. Thirdly, given this years budget cuts, the cost of operation is inordinately high, even above the income generated by the Center.

An alternative plan is being pursued and will be reviewed by the Student Affairs Committee early next week. I encourage you to communicate with your representative on that Committee.

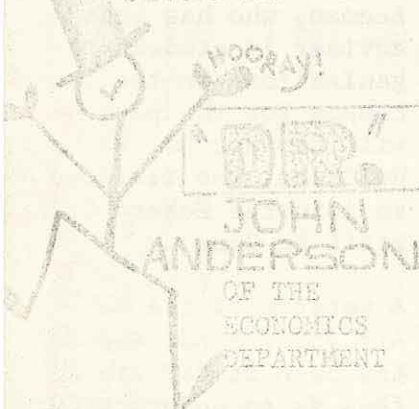

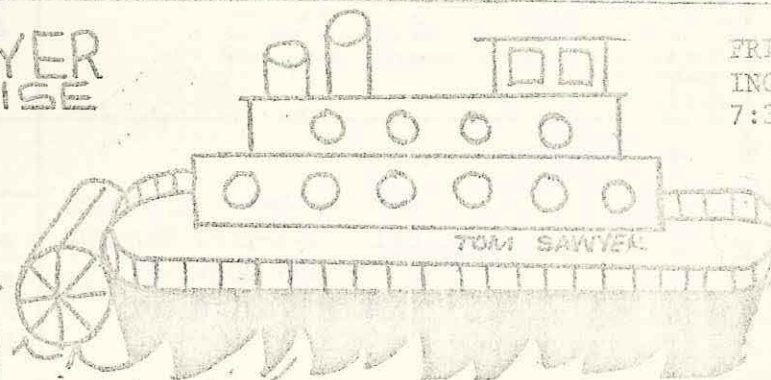
